Non-agricultural workers in informal sector based on Employment - Unemployment survey 1999-2000

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Preface

The National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO) has been carrying out all-India household surveys on employment and unemployment with a large sample usually once in five years. The sixth such survey was conducted in the 55th round (July 1999 – June 2000). The previous five quinquennial surveys were conducted during the 27th (October 1972 - September 1973), the 32nd (July 1977 - June 1978), the 38th (January-December 1983), the 43rd (July 1987 - June 1988) and the 50th (July 1999-June 2000) rounds.

A notable feature of the present employment-unemployment survey is the collection of information for the first time on certain features of the enterprises in which the usual status workers of the sampled households worked. This report presents various estimates with regard to non-agricultural workers along with their correlates. It contains four Chapters and an Appendix. Chapter 1 is introductory and Chapter 2 deals with the concepts and definitions of important terms used in the survey and which are relevant to this report. Chapter 3 describes the sample design and estimation procedure followed in the survey. Finally, Chapter 4 deals with the summary findings of the survey relating to the various characteristics of non-agricultural workers.

The schedule of enquiry for the survey is broadly similar to that adopted in previous quinquennial rounds. The Field Operations Division (FOD) of the Organisation conducted the fieldwork for the survey. The collected data were processed and tabulated by the Data Processing Division (DPD) of the NSSO. The Survey Design & Research Division (SDRD) of the NSSO developed the survey design and prepared the report. I am grateful to the Chairman and members of the Governing Council and Heads of various Divisions of the NSSO and their colleagues for the contribution made in preparing the report.

Comments/suggestions from the readers will be most welcome.

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HIGHLIGHTS

This report is based on the sixth quinquennial survey on employment and unemployment conducted in the 55th round of NSS during July,1999 to June,2000. The survey was spread over 6208 villages and 4176 urban blocks covering 1,65,244 households and enumerated 8,19,013 persons. Employment of non-agricultural workers was measured by usual status with a reference period of one year. Unless otherwise stated, 'all' usual status workers were considered, i.e. workers in terms of both their principal and subsidiary status. The informal sector was constituted of unincorporated proprietary and partnership enterprises. Some of the key findings of the survey on non-agricultural workers are stated below.

- During 1999-2000, the proportion of non-agricultural workers among usual status 'all' workers was estimated as 24% in rural areas and 91% in urban areas.
- During 1999-2000, among non-agricultural workers, about 71% in rural areas and 68% in urban areas were employed in the *informal sector*. This proportion was higher for females 75% and 69% in rural and urban areas respectively than for males, for whom the proportions are 70% and 67% in rural and urban areas respectively.
- Among self-employed non-agricultural workers, about 91% in rural areas and 95% in urban areas reported to have worked in the *informal sector*. However, among regular salaried non-agricultural workers, fewer were employed in the *informal sector*: only 33% in rural areas and 40% in urban areas.
- More than four-fifths of all non-agricultural workers engaged in *wholesale or retail trade* etc. or in *hotels and restaurants* belonged to the informal sector alone. This was true in rural or urban areas and even when male or female non-agricultural workers were considered separately. Among *manufacturing* workers also, the proportion of non-agricultural workers employed in the *informal sector* was quite significant more so in rural than in urban areas.
- *Manufacturing* sector was the single most important provider of employment. The survey estimates that in rural areas, about 31% of the non-agricultural and 36% of the *informal sector* workers were employed in manufacturing activities. In urban areas, 25% of the non-agricultural and 27% of the *informal sector* workers were employed in them.

- For a very high proportion of non-agricultural workers residing in rural areas, their work place too was located in rural areas itself. The proportion for female workers was higher (84%) than that for male workers (74%). These proportions were even higher when employment in the *informal sector* alone is considered. For female workers employed in the *informal sector* alone the proportion was as high as 92%, the corresponding proportion for males being 82%.
- Among all non-agricultural workers residing in urban areas, about 81% are estimated to have their work place in urban areas itself. This proportion was slightly higher (83%) when workers employed in the *informal sector* were considered. The proportion for female workers was higher than that for male workers.
- The survey estimated that about 20% of all non-agricultural workers in rural areas and 36% in urban areas were employed in enterprises that maintained written accounts. When workers employed in the *informal sector* alone was considered, these proportions were much lower 11% in rural areas and 24% in urban areas.
- Self-employed workers who carried out their work wholly or mainly under product specifications comprised 22% of the self-employed in rural areas and 19% of the self-employed in urban areas.

Chapter 1

Introduction

1. The report in perspective

- 1.1 An all-India survey on the situation of employment and unemployment in India during the period July,1999-June,2000 was carried out as part of the 55th round of the National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO). In this survey, a nation-wide enquiry was conducted to provide estimates on various characteristics pertaining to employment and unemployment in India and some characteristics associated with them at the national and state levels. In this survey, information on various facets of employment and unemployment in India were collected through a schedule of enquiry (schedule 10). A sub-set of sample households within the survey period were revisited after a gap of three months and an abridged form of schedule 10, viz. schedule 10.1, comprising the main items of enquiry of schedule 10 was canvassed for these households. Based on the data collected during the entire period, estimates pertaining to employment-unemployment in India along with various characteristics associated with them have been presented in this report.
- 1.2 A notable feature of the present employment and unemployment survey has been the inclusion of certain probing questions for the first time to usual status workers regarding certain features of the enterprises in which they work. In this connection, it may be noted that the NSSO during the 55th round has also collected information on non-agricultural enterprises in the informal sector i.e. enterprises with type of ownership as proprietary or partnership by canvassing schedule 2.0 on the sample enterprises. However, there were significant differences regarding the way of data collection, the approach followed and the concepts used in these two above mentioned surveys. All the data in schedule 10 were collected through some members of the household to which the worker belonged. On the other hand, in Sch.2.0, the respondents were owners of the enterprises and all information on workers were obtained as per their response. Further, in schedule 10, information on workers and on various features of enterprises having a bearing on their work like location of work place, status of accounts etc. were collected whereas in schedule 2.0, the emphasis was more on such details of the enterprises like their receipts, operating expenses, assets owned etc., and very few items were exclusively on workers. Even in terms of coverage of the non-agricultural sector, it was much more extensive in sch.10 which has been included in the present report.

2. Background

- 2.1 One of the important surveys conducted by the NSSO is the quinquennial survey on employment-unemployment. The first such survey was done during September 1972-October 1973 corresponding to the 27th round of NSSO. The present survey is the sixth in the series.
- 2.2 Past Surveys: To assess the volume and structure of employment and unemployment, starting with the 9th round (May-September,1955), NSSO conducted a number of surveys on employment and unemployment. To give a firm conceptual framework for conducting such surveys, the Planning Commission, in the year 1970, set up an "Expert Committee on unemployment estimates", (popularly known as the Dantwala Committee), which reviewed these surveys and the indicators generated from such surveys. Based on concepts and definitions recommended by this committee, the first quinquennial survey on employment and unemployment was conducted in the 27th round of NSS. Since then, four quinquennial comprehensive surveys on employment and

unemployment situation in India have been carried out by the NSSO, in which concepts and procedures were based primarily on the recommendations of the Dantwala Committee. These four surveys were conducted during the 32nd round (July,1977-June,1978), 38th round (January,1983-December,1983), 43rd round (July,1987-June,1988) and 50th round (July,1993-June,1994), respectively.

- 2.3 Other surveys on employment-unemployment: Apart from these five quinquennial surveys on employment and unemployment, NSSO have been regularly collecting information on certain key items on employment and unemployment from a limited set of households in each round since its 45th round (July,1989-June,1990) through the schedule on Household Consumer Expenditure (Schedule 1.0). These are on the usual and current weekly status employment and unemployment, category of employment, industrial distribution of the usually employed, etc. The results of such surveys have been published up to the 54th round (January-June,1998).
- 2.4 *The present survey*: In the present survey, information on some new items and additional information on some items that were canvassed in earlier rounds have been collected. This has been done following the suggestion made by the Working Group set up to finalise the survey methodology and schedules of enquiry of the 55th round. Some of the more important among such changes, which have enlarged the scope of the survey and could have a bearing on the estimates, are stated below:
- a) In the schedule of enquiry, while the past practice was to record the details for *only one* subsidiary usual economic activity of all the members of the household, in this round, details of *two* subsidiary usual economic activities pursued by them for relatively more time were recorded.
- b) In this round, for the first time in the employment-unemployment schedule, certain probing questions were asked to the usual status workers to identify the size of employment in the non-agricultural unincorporated enterprises (i.e., the proprietary and partnership enterprises other than those covered under Annual Survey of Industries (ASI)), along with some other characteristics of those enterprises, where such workers were employed.

Further, departing from the past practice of canvassing schedule 10 and schedule 1.0 (household consumer expenditure) on the same set of households, in this round, these two schedules of enquiry were canvassed in two separate sets of households.

3. Scope

- 3.1 *Items of enquiry*: As in the past, in the present survey too, NSSO collected data on some characteristics, based on which, estimates of employment and unemployment, measured in terms of 3 basic approaches viz. usual status, current weekly status and current daily status can be obtained. The reference period for these approaches differ it being 365 days preceding the date of survey for "usual status", 7 days preceding the date of survey for "current weekly status" and each day of the 7 days preceding the date of survey for "current daily status".
- 3.2 Data were collected on the activity status of all persons, i.e. for workers, for those seeking or available for work and also for those remaining out of labour force. A worker could be self-employed or enjoy regular salaries/wages or be employed on casual wage basis. Data on this aspect, along with the industry of work of the worker and his/her occupation, were collected during this survey. In order to reveal the multi-dimensional features of the employment-unemployment

situation in India, information on several correlates pertaining to it were also gathered. In addition, probing questions were put to the workers in order to understand the extent of underutilization of the labour time and acquire more specific information in this regard. An effort was also made to collect information on the qualitative aspects of employment like changes in activity status, occupation /industry, availability of trade unions/associations, nature of employment, etc. Data were also collected regarding non-agricultural workers (i.e. those working in an industry other than agriculture and related activities like hunting, forestry, logging and fishing) by their activity status, location of work place, type of enterprises where they work and some other characteristics. Such detailed data for non-agricultural workers were collected for the first time in this survey.

- 3.3 It is proposed to bring out several reports on the detailed information on various items of inquiry separately, at a later date. The first report viz. Report No.455 presented the key results on employment and unemployment in India 1999-2000. The second report, Report No. 458 dealt in some detail with the employment-unemployment estimates measured in terms of the three basic approaches of usual status, current weekly status and current daily status and their patterns along with their correlates. It also covered some aspects of underemployment. The report also gave the results generated at all-India level and some important results for different states/union territories. The present report third in the series deals with of non-agricultural workers by various attributes such as their activity status, broad industry of work, enterprise type, location of workplace etc. with special emphasis on workers in the informal sector, i.e. those working in proprietary or partnership type of enterprises.
- 3.4 *Geographical Coverage*: The survey covered the whole of the Indian Union excepting (i) Ladakh & Kargil districts of Jammu and Kashmir, (ii) 768 interior villages of Nagaland situated beyond 5 kms. of the bus route and (iii) 172 villages of Andaman & Nicobar Islands which remain inaccessible throughout the year. A few other areas of Jammu & Kashmir were also excluded from the survey coverage owing to unfavourable field conditions.

4. The survey in brief

- 4.1. *Method of data collection*: The survey used the interview method of data collection from a sample of randomly selected households. The sample design on the basis of which such selection was made is stated in brief in the following sub-section.
- 4.2 *Period of survey and work programme*: The fieldwork of 55th round of NSSO started from 1st July, 1999 and continued till 30th June, 2000. As usual, the survey period of this round was divided into four sub-rounds, each with a duration of three months, the 1st sub-round period ranging from July to September,1999, the 2nd sub-round period from October to December 1999 and so on. Equal number of sample FSU's was allotted for survey in each of these four sub-rounds.

5. Sample design

5.1 An outline of the sampling design: The sampling design adopted for the survey was essentially a stratified multi-stage one for both rural and urban areas. The first stage units (FSUs) were villages (panchayat wards for Kerala) for rural areas and NSS Urban Frame Survey (UFS) blocks for urban areas. The ultimate stage units (USUs) were households. The procedure for selection of fsus/usus are given in detail in chapter 3 of this report. Large FSUs were subdivided into hamlet–groups (rural)/sub-blocks (urban). Details of the formation of hamlet–group/sub-blocks and procedure of selection of households are also given in chapter 3.

- 5.2 Sampling Frame for FSUs: The list of villages (panchayat wards for Kerala) as per 1991 Census and latest lists of UFS blocks of NSSO were respectively used for selection of rural and urban sample FSUs. For selection of sample villages from the State of Jammu & Kashmir, the list of villages as per 1981 Census was used as the sampling frame. Moreover, all the uninhabited villages of the country as per 1991 Census, interior villages of Nagaland situated beyond 5 kms. of a bus route and inaccessible villages of Andaman & Nicobar Islands were left out of the survey coverage of the NSS 55th round.
- 5.3 Sample Size first stage units: A total number of 10,384 FSUs (6,208 villages and 4,176 urban blocks) were selected for survey in the central sample at the all-India level in the 55th round for canvassing schedule 10. Sample size for the whole round for each State/UT x Sector (i.e. rural/urban) was allocated equally among the 4 sub-rounds. Sample FSUs for each sub-round were selected afresh in the form of 2 independent sub-samples. Thus, there were 8 such sub-samples. In addition, 3894 FSUs 1298 in each of the sub-rounds 2, 3 and 4, corresponding to sub-samples 1, 3 and 5 were re-visited for canvassing schedule 10.1.
- 5.4. Sample size second stage units: For schedule 10, in each of the eight sub-samples, from each selected village in rural areas and from each selected urban block in urban areas, a sample of 12 households were surveyed. Apart from this, in the 3 re-visited sub-samples, viz. sub-samples 1, 3 and 5, the abridged schedule 10, viz. schedule 10.1, was canvassed during the re-visit to the same set of households. In addition, in these re-visited sub-samples, from among the newly formed households found during the re-visit of a FSU, at most 1 household was surveyed from each of the two segments and only schedule 10 was canvassed in those households. In the central sample, 1,65,244 households were actually surveyed 97,986 in rural areas and 67,258 in urban areas. As regards the actual number of persons surveyed, it was 5,09,779 in the rural sector and 3,09,234 in the urban sector.

6. Contents of the Report

- 6.1 As stated earlier, this report deals with various estimates—with regard to non-agricultural workers along with their correlates as obtained from tables generated on data collected on relevant items for the entire round. Consequently, all discussions in this report are limited to only such items/concepts, based on which estimates have been generated. A detailed explanation of these are given in the next chapter entitled 'Concepts and Definitions'.
- 6.2 This report contains four chapters, including the present introductory chapter, and appendix tables. Chapter 2 states in detail the concepts and definitions of only those terms used in the survey in connection with the various items covered in this report. Chapter 3 gives a fairly detailed description of the sample design and estimation procedure used for the survey. Chapters 4 discusses the main findings of the survey relating to these items. The detailed tables based on which this report is brought out are presented in the Appendix.
- 6.3 *Tables in Appendix*: Appendix of the report contains twelve tables. Of these, nine provide estimates of non-agricultural workers by various attributes such as their activity status, enterprise type, location of workplace, etc. The other three tables present estimates of those self-employed persons in the non-agricultural sector by some combination of attributes like location of workplace, their working as per given product specification, etc.

6.4 All the estimates presented in this report are based on Central sample data only. Further, the cell-level figures in any of the detailed tables, when added up, may not exactly equal the figure shown against the "total" column (or line) due to (i) rounding off and/or (ii) presence of non-response cases.

Chapter 2

Concepts and Definitions

- 2.0 The concepts and definitions of some important terms used in the survey and which are relevant to this report viz., those used to generate the tables and various estimates on employment-unemployment are explained in the following paragraphs.
- 2.1 *Household*: A group of persons who normally lived together and took food from a common kitchen constituted a household. The adverb "normally" means that temporary visitors were excluded but temporary stay-aways were included. Thus a child residing in a hostel for studies was excluded from the household of his/her parents, but a resident employee or a resident domestic servant or paying guest (but not just a tenant in the house) was included in the employer's/host's household. "Living together" was given more importance than "sharing food from a common kitchen" in drawing the boundaries of a household in case the two criteria were in conflict. However, in the special case of a person taking food with his family but sleeping elsewhere (say, in a shop or a different house) due to space shortage, the household formed by such a person's family members was taken to include the person also. Each inmate of a hotel, mess, boarding-lodging house, hostel, etc., was considered to be a single-member household except that a family living in a hotel (say) was considered one household only. The same principle was applicable for the residential staff of such establishments.
- 2.2 *Enterprise*: An enterprise is an undertaking which is engaged in the production and /or distribution of some goods and /or services meant mainly for the purpose of sale, whether fully or partly. An enterprise may be owned and operated by a single household or by several households jointly, or by an institutional body.
- 2.3 *Economic activity*: Any activity resulting in production of goods and services that add value to national product was considered as an economic activity. Such activities included production of all goods and services for market (market activities), i.e. production for pay or profit, and, the production of primary commodities for own consumption and own account production of fixed assets, among the non-market activities.
- 2.3.1The entire spectrum of human activity falls into two categories—economic and non-economic activities. The economic activities have two parts market activities and non-market activities. Market activities are those that involve remuneration to those who perform it i.e., activity performed for pay or profit. These are essentially production of goods and services for the market including those of government services, etc. Non-market activities are the production for own consumption of primary products including own account processing of primary products and own account production of fixed assets.
- 2.3.2 The full spectrum of economic activities as defined in the UN system of National Accounts (1968) was not covered in the definition adopted for the NSS 55th round survey of Employment and Unemployment. The former included activities like own account processing of primary products among other things. In the NSS surveys, activities relating to the production of primary goods for own consumption, was restricted to the agriculture sector only and did not include the activities in mining

and quarrying sector. The coverage of economic activities was, however, the same as in the 50th round.

The term 'economic activity', therefore, included:

- (i) all the market activities performed for pay or profit which result in production of goods and services for exchange.
- (ii) of the non-market activities,
 - (a) all the activities relating to the agricultural sector (industry Divisions 01 to 05 of NIC 1998) which result in production (including gathering of uncultivated crops, forestry, collection of firewood, hunting, fishing etc.) of agricultural produce for own consumption

and

(b) the activities relating to the own-account production of fixed assets. Own account production of fixed assets include construction of own houses, roads, wells etc., and of machinery, tools etc., for household enterprise and also construction of any private or community facilities free of charge. A person may be engaged in own account construction either in the capacity of a labourer or a supervisor.

As per the practice followed in earlier rounds, certain activities like prostitution, begging, smuggling etc., which though fetched earnings, were not considered as economic activities.

- 2.4 *Activity status*: It is the activity situation in which a person was found during a reference period with regard to the person's participation in economic and non-economic activities. According to this, a person could be in one or a combination of the following three broad activity statuses during a reference period:
 - (i) working or being engaged in economic activity (work) as defined above,
 - (ii) being not engaged in economic activity (work) but either making tangible efforts to seek 'work' or being available for 'work' if the 'work' is available and
 - (iii) being not engaged in any economic activity (work) and also not available for 'work'.

Broad activity statuses mentioned in (i) and (ii) above are associated with 'being in labour force' and the last with 'not being in the labour force'. Within the labour force, broad activity status (i) and (ii) were associated with 'employment' and 'unemployment', respectively.

2.4.1 Categories of activity status: Identification of each individual into a unique situation could pose a problem when more than one of the three broad activity statuses listed above were concurrently obtained for a person. In such an eventuality, the identification uniquely under any one of the three broad activity statuses was done by adopting either the major time or priority criterion. The former was used for classification of persons according to the 'usual activity status' approach and the latter for classification of persons according to the 'current activity status' approach. Each of the three broad activity statuses was further sub-divided into several detailed activity categories. If a person

categorised as engaged in economic activity by adopting one of the two criteria mentioned above was found to be pursuing more than one economic activity during the reference period, the appropriate detailed activity status code related to the activity in which relatively more time had been spent. A similar procedure was adopted for assigning detailed activity code for persons categorised as engaged in non-economic activity and pursuing more than one non-economic activity. The detailed activity categories under each of the three broad activity statuses used in the survey (along with the codes assigned to them as indicated in brackets) are stated below:

- (i) situation of working or being engaged in economic activities (employed):
 - (a) worked in household enterprise (self-employed) as own account worker (11);
 - (b) worked in household enterprise (self-employed) as employer (12);
 - (c) worked as helper in household enterprises (unpaid family worker) (21);
 - (d) worked as regular salaried/wage employee (31);
 - (e) worked as casual wage labour (i) in public works (41), (ii) in other types of work (51);
 - (f) had work in household enterprise but did not work due to: (i) sickness (61), (ii) other reasons (62); and
 - (g) had regular salaried/wage employment but did not work due to: (i) sickness (71), (ii) other reasons (72);
- (ii) situation of being not engaged in work but seeking or available for work (unemployed):
 - (a) sought work (81) and
 - (b) did not seek but was available for work (82)
- (iii) situation of being not available for work (not in labour force):
 - (a) attended educational institutions (91);
 - (b) attended domestic duties only (92);
 - (c) attended domestic duties and was also engaged in free collection of goods (vegetables, roots, firewood, cattle-feed, etc.) sewing, tailoring, weaving, etc. for household use (93);
 - (d) rentiers, pensioners, remittance recipients, etc. (94);
 - (e) not able to work due to disability (95);
 - (f) beggars, prostitutes (96);
 - (g) others (97) and
 - (h) did not work due to sickness (for casual workers only) (98).
- 2.5 Workers (or employed): Persons who were engaged in any economic activity or who, despite their attachment to economic activity, abstained from work for reason of illness, injury or other physical disability, bad weather, festivals, social or religious functions or other contingencies necessitating temporary absence from work, constituted workers. Unpaid helpers who assisted in the operation of an economic activity in the household farm or non-farm activities were also considered as workers. All the workers were assigned one of the detailed activity statuses under the broad activity category 'working' or 'being engaged in economic activity' (or employed).
- 2.6 Seeking or available for work (or unemployed): Persons, who owing to lack of work, had not worked but either sought work through employment exchanges, intermediaries, friends or relatives or

by making applications to prospective employers or expressed their willingness or availability for work under the prevailing conditions of work and remuneration, were considered as those who were 'seeking or available for work' (or unemployed).

- 2.7 *Labour force*: Persons, who, were either 'working' (or employed) or 'seeking or available for work' (or unemployed) constituted the labour force. Persons who were neither 'working' nor 'seeking or available for work' for various reasons during the reference period were considered as 'out of labour force'. The persons under this latter category were students, those engaged in domestic duties, rentiers, pensioners, recipients of remittances, those living on alms, infirm or disabled persons, too young or too old persons, prostitutes, smugglers, etc. and casual labourers not working due to sickness.
- 2.8 Self-employed: Persons who operated their own farm or non-farm enterprises or were engaged independently in a profession or trade on own-account or with one or a few partners were deemed to be self-employed in household enterprises. The essential feature of the self-employed is that they have autonomy (i.e., how, where and when to produce) and economic independence (i.e., market, scale of operation and money) for carrying out their operation. The fee or remuneration received by them comprised two parts share of their labour and profit of the enterprise. In other words, their remuneration was determined wholly or mainly by sales or profits of the goods or services which were produced. Persons working under the 'putting out' system, viz., where a part of production which is 'put out' is performed in different household enterprises and not at the 'employer's' establishment were also deemed as self-employed. 'Employer' in this context meant a person / enterprise who either directly or through some intermediary gave out work to such workers.
- 2.8.1 Categories of self-employed persons: Self-employed persons were categorised as follows:
 - (i) *own-account workers*: those self-employed persons who operated their enterprises on their own account or with one or a few partners and who, during the reference period, by and large, ran their enterprise without hiring any labour. They could, however, have had unpaid helpers to assist them in the activity of the enterprise;
 - (ii) *employers*: those self-employed persons who worked on their own account or with one or a few partners and, who, by and large, ran their enterprise by hiring labour; and
 - (iii) *helpers in household enterprise*: those self-employed persons (mostly family members) who were engaged in their household enterprises, working full or part time and did not receive any regular salary or wages in return for the work performed. They did not run the household enterprise on their own but assisted the related person living in the same household in running the household enterprise.
- 2.9 **Regular salaried/wage employee**: These were persons who worked in others' farm or non-farm enterprises (both household and non-household) and, in return, received salary or wages on a regular basis (i.e. not on the basis of daily or periodic renewal of work contract). This category included not only persons getting time wage but also persons receiving piece wage or salary and paid apprentices, both full time and part-time.

- 2.10 *Casual wage labour*: A person who was casually engaged in others' farm or non-farm enterprises (both household and non-household) and, in return, received wages according to the terms of the daily or periodic work contract, was a casual wage labour.
- 2.11 *Different approaches followed to determine activity status*: The persons surveyed were classified into various activity categories on the basis of the activities pursued by them during certain specified reference periods. There were three reference periods for this survey. These are: (i) one year (ii) one week and (iii) each day of the reference week. Based on these three periods, three different measures of activity status are arrived at. These are termed respectively as usual status, current weekly status and the current daily status. However, in this report, the first measure only has been used. As such the procedure adopted to arrive at the first measure only is elucidated below.
- 2.11.1 *Usual activity status*: The usual activity status relates to the activity status of a person during the reference period of 365 days preceding the date of survey. The activity status on which a person spent relatively longer time (i.e. major time criterion) during the 365 days preceding the date of survey is considered as the *principal usual activity status* of the person. To decide the principal usual activity of a person, he/she was first categorised as belonging to the labour force or not during the reference period on the basis of major time criterion. Persons thus adjudged as not belonging to the labour force were assigned the broad activity status 'neither working nor available for work'. For persons belonging to the labour force, the broad activity status of either 'working' or 'not working but seeking and/or available for work' was ascertained based on the same criterion viz. relatively longer time spent in accordance with either of the two broad statuses within the labour force during the 365 days preceding the date of survey. Within the broad activity status so determined, the detailed activity status of a person pursuing more than one such activity was determined once again on the basis of the relatively longer time spent on such activities. In terms of activity codes (stated earlier in para 1.3.1), codes 11-51 were applicable for persons classified as workers, while code 81 was assigned to people either seeking or available for work (unemployed persons) and codes 91-97 for those who were out of labour force.
- 2.11.2 *Subsidiary economic activity status*: A person whose principal usual status was determined on the basis of the major time criterion could have pursued some economic activity *for a relatively shorter time* (minor time) during the reference period of 365 days preceding the date of survey. The status in which such economic activity was pursued was the subsidiary economic activity status of that person. Thus, activity status codes 11-51 only were applicable for persons reporting some subsidiary economic activity. It may be noted that engagement in work in subsidiary capacity could arise out of the following two situations, viz.
 - (i) a person could be engaged for a relatively longer period during the last 365 days in one economic/non-economic activity and for a relatively shorter period in another economic activity, and
 - (ii) a person could be pursuing one economic activity/ non-economic activity almost throughout the year in the principal usual activity status and simultaneously pursue another economic activity for a relatively shorter period in a subsidiary capacity.

- 2.11.3 Number of subsidiary economic activities pursued during last 365 days: For persons reporting some subsidiary activity, the number of subsidiary activities pursued by him/her during last 365 days was ascertained and recorded. However, details of a maximum of two such subsidiary economic activities were recorded. The activities having different work status was considered as different activities. Activities within the same work status but with different industry and/or occupation were also considered as different activities. If the person was engaged in two or more subsidiary economic activities, the details of the subsidiary economic activity pursued for the maximum time period among all the subsidiary economic activities, or in other words, the major subsidiary economic activity was deemed as 'subsidiary status number I' and the next major one as 'subsidiary status number II' were recorded.
- 2.12 *Industry-occupation*: The description of the industry-occupation was relevant to the type of economic activity pursued by the person. NIC-1998 was followed for classifying industries and NCO-1968 was followed for classifying occupations. In case two or more industry-occupation combinations corresponding to the status code were reported by a person, the principal industry-occupation was taken as the one in which *relatively more time* was spent during the reference period by the person. It may be noted that under Division 95 of NIC 1998, on "Private households with employed persons", six additional codes have been introduced for recording 5 digit entries for industry codes in the survey viz., housemaid /servant (95001), cook (95002), gardener (95003), gatekeeper/chowkidar/watchman (95004), governess/baby-sitter (95005) and for 'others' (95009).
- 2.13 *Non-agricultural workers*: In this round, an attempt was made to gather data on certain particulars of non-agricultural enterprises in which members of the sample households were usually engaged in. Thus, data were collected on these features of such enterprises for household members working in industries with 2-digit industry codes (i.e. industry divisions) 10 to 99 which covered the non-agricultural sector. These features are stated below.
- 2.13.1 *Location of workplace:* The location of workplace for each of the working members of the household was categorised as follows: (i) no fixed workplace or (ii) workplace located in (a) own dwelling, (b) own enterprise/unit/office/shop but outside own dwelling, (c) employer's dwelling, (d) employer's enterprise/unit/office/shop but outside employer's dwelling, (e) street with fixed location, (f) construction sites or (iii) others. This was done for rural as well as urban areas.
- 2.13.2 *Enterprise type*: The type of enterprise where household members worked was categorised as: (i) proprietary: (a) male, (b) female; (ii) partnership: (a) with members from same household, (b) with members from different household, (iii) public sector enterprise, (iv) semi-public enterprise, (v) others and (vi) not known. Information was recorded under the last mentioned category if the informant did not know the type of enterprise in which a household member worked and the investigator was unable to collect such information in spite of his/her best efforts.

Definitions of enterprises types as used in this survey are stated below:

Proprietary - An individual is the sole owner of the enterprise.

Partnership – By this was meant the relation between persons who have agreed to share the profits of a business carried on by all or any one of them acting for all. There may be two or more owners, belonging to the same or different households, on a partnership basis, **with or without formal registration** (where there is a tacit understanding about the distribution of profit among the so-called partners).

Public sector enterprise - An enterprise wholly owned/run/managed by Central or State governments, quasi-government, institutions, local bodies like universities, education boards, municipalities etc. An enterprise was not treated as a public sector enterprise if it was run on a loan granted by government, local body etc..

Semi-public enterprise – An enterprise in which besides private shareholders, government (Central/State/local bodies etc.) also held some shares, irrespective of who held the majority of shares.

- Others Any other type of enterprise, other than those types covered above was categorised as 'others'. Such enterprises included co-operative societies, public limited companies, other units covered under ASI and institutional enterprises other than those described above which are managed by public trusts or societies (other than co-operative societies), training school/institutions etc.
- 2.13.3 *Maintenance of written accounts*: The status of accounts of the enterprise was ascertained and recorded as per the following categories: (i) maintains accounts: when accounts were available and also usable, (ii) does not maintain accounts: when records were either not maintained or if at all maintained was done very haphazardly and not usable for accounting purpose but the owners kept some records for their own use, (iii) not known: when the informant was unable to provide information in this respect.
- 2.13.4 *Number of workers*: This was the average number of workers employed on a day of operation irrespective of whether they were hired workers, were paid or unpaid workers of the household who were involved in the production process irrespective of age and sex. The number of workers were categorised as:
- (i) less than 6, (ii) 6 to 9, (iii) 10 and above but less than 20, (iv) 20 and above, (v) not known. The last category covered those cases where the informant was unable to provide information on the number of workers.
- 2.13.5 Status of use of electricity for manufacturing: This item was collected only for persons working in manufacturing enterprises (i.e., for those with industry divisions 15 to 37 as per NIC 1998) by 3 categories. Category 1 viz. 'using electricity' covered cases where the enterprise in which the person worked used electricity for manufacturing purposes. Category 2 viz. 'not using electricity' covered cases where use of electricity was exclusively for purposes other than manufacturing/production such as, for comfort, security, illumination, etc., Category 3 viz. 'not known' covered cases where the informant was unable to reply to the query.
- 2.13.6 *Self employed non-agricultural workers*: In this round, data was collected on some interesting aspects of enterprises exclusively for the self-employed persons among the non-agricultural workers. These aspects are stated in the following paragraphs.

- 2.13.7 Status of working under given specifications: It was ascertained whether in relation to his/her activity, the person carried out the production (i.e. goods and services) on the basis of given or laid down product-specifications of the 'employer' (see para 2.8 earlier for explanation of the term 'employer' in this context). When a person procured the order/contract from the 'employer' for his or her household enterprise to supply goods, normally an implicit or explicit specification of the product, written or oral, is laid by the 'employer'. Sometimes, the whole activity is carried out under the specifications of the 'employer', or a part under the specifications of the 'employer' and the remaining part, with his own specification. The appropriate situation was ascertained and categorised as follows: (i) wholly, (ii) mainly, (iii) partly, (iv) no and (v) not known. Of these categories, all, except the fourth are self-explanatory. The fourth category covered cases where the self-employed carried out activities according to their own specification and for all the customers.
- 2.13.8 Status of source providing credit/ raw material/ equipment: Data on some features mentioned hereafter were collected for only those self-employed people who worked wholly or mainly under the given product specifications. For such people, three aspects of their enterprise were integrated under this status viz. credit, raw material and equipment. It was ascertained from such self-employed persons whether the 'employer' who gave product-specifications (in terms of the order/contract) also provided credit/raw material/equipment to them. Here, 'credit' meant cash advance for a particular order or a group of orders and for working capital only (i.e. for purchase of raw material and meeting other running expenses). However, credit provided for purchase of equipment was not considered as 'credit'; instead, it was considered as 'provided for equipments'. The various categories under which this integrated status was collected are: (i) own arrangement, (ii) provided by the enterprise for (a) credit only, (b) raw material only, (c) equipments only, (d) credit and raw material only, (e) credit and equipment only, (f) raw material and equipment only and (g) credit, raw material and equipment. Another category, viz. 'not known', covered cases where the informant was not aware of the nature of such arrangement.
- 2.13.9 *Number of outlets of disposal*: Outlet meant the 'employer' for whom the self-employed had worked. There may be cases where the self-employed had worked under the specifications of more than one 'employer'. Categories under this item were: (i) one outlet, (ii) two outlets, (iii) three or more outlets and (iv) not known
- 2.13.10 *Basis of payment*: There were two categories under which data were collected for this item viz. (i) piece rate and (ii) contract rate. The first category covered cases where the payment received for the work done on order/contract was on the basis of piece rate, while the second category covered the rest of the cases.
- 2.13.11 *Type of specifications*: Data were collected on this item by three categories: (i) written, (ii) oral and (iii) not known. The first two categories covered cases where the specifications laid by the 'employer' were written or oral respectively, while the third one covered cases where such specification was unknown.

Chapter 3

Sample Design and Estimation Procedure

3.1 Sample Design

- 3.1.1. A stratified multi-stage sampling design for rural as well as urban areas was adopted for selection of the sample units for the survey. The first stage units (FSU) were the census villages (panchayat wards for Kerala) for rural areas and the NSSO Urban Frame Survey (UFS) blocks for urban areas. The ultimate stage units (USU) were the households for both rural and urban areas.
- 3.1.2 Selection of the first-stage units: The various steps involved before making the selection of the FSUs are discussed at length in the following few paragraphs before taking up the issue of selection of USUs within a FSU.
- 3.1.2.1 Sampling frame for the first stage units (FSU's): For rural areas, the list of census villages as per 1991 population census (list of census villages as per 1981 Census for the State of Jammu & Kashmir) constituted the sampling frame for selection of sample FSUs for most of the states. For the rural areas of Kerala, however, the list of panchayat wards was used as the sampling frame for selection of panchayat wards. For Nagaland, the list of villages located within 5 kms. of a bus route constituted the sampling frame, whereas, the list of accessible villages constituted the sampling frame for Andaman & Nicobar Islands. All the uninhabited villages of the country as per 1991 Census were left out of the survey coverage of the NSS 55th round. For the urban areas, the latest lists of UFS blocks constituted the sampling frame for selection of sample FSUs.
- 3.1.2.2 Stratification of the first stage units in rural areas: From the list of villages of each State/Union Territory (U.T.), initially, two special strata were formed by considering villages (a) with very small population and (b) with very high population. These are formally stated below:

Stratum 1: all FSU's with population between 1 to 100, Stratum 2: FSU's with population more than 15,000.

The above two strata were spread across a given state and were not confined to any particular administrative division within the state. Each of the above two strata was formed if at least 50 such FSU's were there in the respective frames. Otherwise, these type of villages were included in the general strata as described below:

After formation of strata 1 and 2 (wherever applicable), the remaining villages of the State/ U.T. were considered for formation of general strata. While forming general strata, efforts were made to treat each district with population less than 2 millions as a separate stratum. If limitation of sample size did not allow forming so many strata, smaller districts within a particular NSS region were merged to form a stratum. Each district with rural population of 2 millions or more as per 1991 Census (1.8 millions or more as per 1981 Census in case of Jammu & Kashmir) was as usual split into a number of strata.

3.1.2.3 Stratification of the first stage units in urban areas: Within each NSS region, strata were formed by grouping towns on the basis of their population as per 1991 population census (1981 Census for the State of Jammu & Kashmir) following certain specifications which are stated below in a tabular form:

^{*} Stratum numbers 3, 4, 5 & 6 remained void if there was only one city in an NSS region with a population of 10 lakhs or more.

It may be noted that if limitation of sample size did not allow forming so many strata, all blocks of stratum 7 were merged with those of stratum 8 and all blocks of stratum 9 were merged with those of stratum 10.

- 3.1.2.4 *Allocation of FSU's among Strata*: At the all-India level, a total number of 10,384 FSU's (6208 villages and 4176 urban blocks) was selected for survey in the *central sample* in the 55th round. The actual state/ U.T. level allocation of FSUs in both the rural and urban sector are given in Table A at the end of this Appendix. The sample size at the state/U.T. level was allocated as follows:
- (a) in rural areas: state/ UT level rural sample size was allocated among the rural strata in proportion to population.
- (b) in urban areas: state/ UT level urban sample size was first allocated among the three classes of towns (i.e. 10 lakh +, 50000 to less than 10 lakhs and less than 50,000) in proportion to population. Then sample allocation for each of the three classes of towns, within an NSS region, was further allocated between two strata types consisting of (i) HA/ IA/ BA blocks, and (ii) the rest in proportion to total number of FSU's in the respective frames with double weightage given to the first category of blocks.
- 3.1.2.5 Sub-round wise allocation: Sample size for the whole round for each State/UT x Sector (i.e. rural/ urban) were allocated equally among the 4 sub-rounds. Stratum level allocations for both rural and urban areas of a sub-round were made in even numbers in order to facilitate selection of FSU's in the form of 2 independent sub-samples. Sub-sample numbers were 1 & 2 for sub-round 1; 3 & 4 for sub-round 2; 5 & 6 for sub-round 3 and 7 & 8 for sub-round 4. One salient feature of the 55th round

was the *rotation sampling scheme* which was adopted for the first time in the NSS for the purpose of collection of employment-unemployment data from central sample only. Under this scheme, 1 subsample of the sampled first stage units (FSU's) of each sub-round was revisited in the subsequent subround. From each such FSU, sample households visited in the previous sub-round for collecting data on employment-unemployment were revisited in the subsequent sub-round for collecting employment-unemployment details.

- 3.1.2.6 Selection of first-stage units: For each sub-round, sample first-stage units from each stratum were selected afresh in the form of 2 independent sub-samples by following circular systematic sampling with:
 - (a) probability proportional to population for all rural strata other than stratum 1, and
 - (b) equal probability for rural stratum 1 as well as for all urban strata.
- 3.1.3 Selection of Ultimate Stage Units within a FSU: The remaining paragraphs of this sub-section outlines the various steps leading to the actual selection of USUs within a FSU.
- 3.1.3.1 Formation of hamlet-groups/ sub-blocks: In some cases, depending upon the approximate present population (P) and approximate total number of non-agricultural enterprises (E) of the villages/ blocks, the FSUs were further divided into a fixed number of hamlet groups/ sub-blocks, as per the rules stated below:

@ no. of hg's/sb's = '1' implies that the whole FSU was considered for listing.

It may be noted that for rural areas of Himachal Pradesh, Sikkim and Poonch, Rajouri, Udhampur and Doda districts of Jammu & Kashmir, number of hamlet groups formed in the village as per population criterio n was: 1 for P < 600, 5 for P = 600 to 999, 6 for P = 1000 to 1199, 7 for P = 1200 to 1399, 8 for P = 1400 to 1599, and so on (procedure remaining unchanged as per enterprise criterion). Further, the higher of the two values obtained as per population and enterprise criteria was taken as the number (D) of hamlet-groups (hg)/ sub-blocks (sb) to be formed in the FSU. In cases where hg's/ sb's were formed in the sample FSU, the same was done by more or less equalizing the population of the different hgs/ sbs of the FSU.

3.1.3.2 Formation of Segments within FSU: The hg/sb having maximum concentration of non-agricultural enterprises was selected with certainty for listing of households/enterprises. This hamlet group/sub-block was referred to as segment 1. From the remaining (D-1) hg's/sb's of the FSU, 2 more hg's/sb's were selected circular systematically and these 2 selected hg's/sb's together were referred to as segment 2 for doing a combined listing of households. The listing of households was done only in segments 1 and 2 of the FSU. The FSUs not requiring hg/sb formation were treated as segment 1 for the purpose of data collection and estimation.

- 3.1.3.3 Sampling frame of households: All households of segments 1 and 2 of the FSU were listed independently and this list of households of the segments 1 and 2 constituted the sampling frame for the purpose of selection of sample households from the corresponding segments.
- 3.1.3.4 Stratification of households: All the households listed in a segment (both rural & urban) were stratified into two second stage strata, viz. 'affluent households' which formed second stage stratum 1, and the rest which formed second stage stratum 2. In the rural sector, a household was classified as 'affluent' if the household owned certain items like motor car/ jeep, colour TV, telephone, etc. or owned land / livestock in excess of certain limits. In the urban sector, the households with MPCE (monthly per capita consumer expenditure) greater than certain limit for a given town/city were treated as 'affluent' households and were included in the frame of second stage stratum 1, and rest of the urban households were included in the frame of second stage stratum 2.
- 3.1.3.5 Selection of households: Sample households were selected from the respective frames by circular systematic sampling with equal probability. For the purpose of systematic sampling, households in the frame of second stage stratum 2 were arranged by means of livelihood x land possessed classes for rural samples and by means of livelihood x MPCE classes for urban samples. The number of households selected for survey on employment–unemployment from different segments x second stage stratum (within a FSU) are specified below:

^{*} The fsus of sub-sample 1, sub-sample 3 and sub-sample 5 were re-visited during sub-round 2, sub-round 3 and sub-round 4 respectively. In the fsus of these re-visit sub-samples, all the households where schedule 10 was previously canvassed (i.e. during the previous sub-round) were re-visited for canvassing schedule 10.1. However, in case such a household could not be surveyed during re-visit, it was substituted and schedule 10 was canvassed in the substituted household. Further, schedule 10 was also canvassed for those households which were 'casualty' during visit 1 but could be surveyed during the re-visit. From among the newly formed households found during the re-visit of a fsu (which constituted the second stage stratum 9), at most 1 household was surveyed from each of the 2 segments and schedule 10 only was canvassed for those households.

3.2 Estimation Procedure

- 3.2.1 This estimation procedure adopted in the 55th round for schedule 10 provides
- (a) estimates on quarterly/ sub-round basis, and
- (b) the estimate of error from the sub-sample replicates.

Tabulated estimate for a quarter/ sub-round was obtained by combining the estimates of the corresponding sub-sample replicates. The estimation procedure adopted in the 55th round for schedule 10 is described below.

- 3.2.2 *Notation:* The notations used for estimation procedure are given below:
 - a = subscript for the a-th stratum
 - r =subscript for the r-th sub-sample replicate (r = 1,2,...,8)
 - q = subscript for the q-th sub-round / quarter (q=1,2,3 & 4)
 - f = subscript for the fth sampled village/block as First Stage Unit (FSU)
 - s = subscript for the s-th segment of sampled village/ block (s= 1 & 2)
 - c = subscript for the c-th second stage stratum of households in the sampled village/ block (c= 1,2); for new households during revisit, c= 9.
 - j = subscript for the j-th sampled household
 - p = subscript for pooled estimate
 - z= size used for selection of an FSU from the sampling frame
 - Z = total of sizes in the sampling frame for the stratum
 - n = number of sampled FSU surveyed within a stratum and a sub-sample replicate (including zero cases and uninhabited cases but excluding casualty cases) and used for tabulation
 - L = number of sub-sample replicates surveyed and used for tabulation
 - D = number of hamlet-groups/ sub-blocks formed in rural/ urban sampled FSU
 - H = total number of households listed in the appropriate frame

- 3.2.3 Estimates of aggregates: If \overrightarrow{P} be the estimate of aggregate of any characteristic y for a given stratum (a), and for a particular sub-round (q) and sub-sample replicate (r), the formula used for estimating a characteristic of household from a given 2nd stage stratum (c) is as specified below:

These formulae are provided for the general case of FSU's having 2 segments 1 & 2. For the FSU's requiring no hg/sb formation, the formula is identical to that given for segment 1 while the contribution from segment 2 is taken as zero.

Finally, the estimate of a characteristic y for a stratum (a), for a particular sub-round (q) and a sub-sample replicate (r) (which actually represented \hat{Y}_{aqr}) was obtained as $\hat{Y} = \sum \hat{Y}_c$.

The combined estimate for a particular stratum and a particular sub-round was computed as the average of sub-sample replicate estimates and is given below:

Estimates for the sub-round (/quarter) \hat{R}_{qr} and \hat{R}_{qp} was obtained by replacing \hat{Y}_r and \hat{Y}_p by \hat{Y}_{qr} and \hat{Y}_{qp} , respectively and \hat{X}_r and \hat{X}_p by \hat{X}_{qr} and \hat{X}_{qp} , respectively.

3.2.5 *Treatment for casualty.*

- I) If $H_{fsc}>0$ but $h_{rfsc}=0$ for a particular 2nd stage stratum of households in a FSU with no hamlet-group/sub-block formation (ie. $D_f=1$), it was a case of casualty and the value of n was reduced by 1.
- II) If $D_f > 1$ and $H_{fs'c} > 0$ but $h_{fs'c} = 0$ for s = 1 (say, s') and if it was not a case for the entire FSU, here n was not reduced by 1 and in this case $[(D_f 1)/2] \times H_{fsc}$ was replaced by $\{H_{fs'c} + [(D_f 1)/2] \times H_{fsc}\}$ in the formula for s = 2.
- III) If $D_f > 1$ and $H_{fs'c} > 0$ but $h_{fs'c} = 0$ for s = 2 (say, s') and if it was not a case for the entire FSU, here n was not reduced by 1 and in this case, H_{fsc} was replaced by $\{H_{fsc} + [(D_{f^{-1}})/2] \times H_{fs'c}\}$ in the formula for s = 1.
- IV) If $H_{fsc} > 0$ but $h_{fsc} = 0$ for a particular second stage stratum of households in both the segments (s=1 & 2) in an FSU, it was a case of casualty and the value of n was reduced by 1.

Chapter 4

Summary of findings

4.1 Introduction

- 4.1.1 As stated in chapter 1, the present report provides estimates of non-agricultural workers with regard to certain characteristics of their enterprise of work at the all-India level (and at the state level in some cases). All such estimates are based on the central sample data only. As mentioned in chapter 1, this is the first time when, in the employment-unemployment schedule, questions were put to the usual status non-agricultural workers on the various particulars of their enterprise of work. This chapter summarises the important findings of the survey based on the responses to these set of questions and discusses the salient features pertaining to these different aspects.
- 4.1.2 The following section, viz. section 2, deals with the distribution of the usual status nonagricultural workers by different types of enterprise in which they worked. This is followed by discussion on their enterprise of work – first in relation to their work statuses and then, to their broad industry of work in sections 3 and 4 respectively. Section 5 deals with workers employed in manufacturing enterprises using electricity for productive purpose. The location of work place of non-agricultural workers is looked into in section 6. The next section deals with the status of accounts of the enterprise of work of non-agricultural workers. In the last section, some features of the self-employeds among the non-agricultural workers were discussed. In all the subsequent sections, the usual activity status refers to activity status of workers taking together the principal status (ps) and subsidiary economic status-I (ss) for persons categorised 'not working' in their principal status. In the summary tables of this report, this has been referred to as usual activity category (ps + ss). Discussions are mainly centred around the all-India estimates. It may be mentioned that while all-India summary results are presented along with write-up, the corresponding results at the state/union territory level are given at the end of this chapter. The convention for table numbering followed in this chapter is: general continuous numbers to tables giving only estimates at the all-India level and the corresponding state level estimates in a table with the same number together with a decimal extension. For example, table 2 (in section 2) gives all-India level estimates while the corresponding state level estimates are given in table 2.1.
- 4.1.3 *Use of estimated aggregates*: A few points on some general aspects of the survey estimates are stated in this para. Compared to the census population or the projections thereof, population estimates from the NSSO surveys are, in general, on the lower side. This difference arises mainly due to the differences in methods and coverage adopted by the NSSO in comparison to the census operation. However, the ratios obtained from the survey are much closer to the ratios obtained using census figures. Usually the estimates on employment- unemployment are presented as ratios. To estimate an absolute number in any category, it is advisable to apply the survey estimates of ratios to the census population or projections thereof, for that category. The estimates of aggregated non-agricultural workers, given in the detailed Appendix tables, may help to combine the ratios but may not be used for deriving estimates of absolute numbers for a characteristic. It may also be noted that as the tables are generally presented as per thousand distribution, the figures are rounded off. Thus, while using the ratios from the survey results, it is to be noted that the accuracy of these derived aggregates will be limited to the number of significant digits available in the ratio or percentage estimates presented in the report. The estimated aggregates, wherever possible, can be used to get ratios with more significant digits.

4.2 Non-agricultural workers in different types of enterprise

4.2.1 At the outset, an idea is given of the proportion of non-agricultural work force within the total work-force at the all-India level. Usual status 'all' workers, i.e. workers in principal and subsidiary economic status taken together, were considered to constitute the work-force. Table 1 presents the proportions of non-agricultural workers among usual status 'all' workers, separately by rural and urban cross-classified by sex. It is seen from the table that the proportion was much higher in urban areas (91%) than that in rural areas (24%). Further, the proportions were higher for males than those for females.

4.2.2 The distribution of non-agricultural workers by their type of enterprise in which they were employed is presented at the all-India level in table 2. The two groups – proprietary and partnership – have been clubbed together. They constitute the un-incorporated proprietary and partnership enterprises – a category defined as *informal sector* in this survey.

4.2.3 The table shows that a high proportion of non-agricultural workers, in rural or urban areas, worked in the *informal sector*. The survey estimated that during 1999-2000, among non-agricultural workers, about 71% in rural areas and 68% in urban areas were employed in the *informal sector*. This proportion is higher for females – 75% and 69% in rural and urban areas respectively than for males, for whom the proportions are 70% and 67% in rural and urban areas

respectively. Thus, it would be of interest to study various characteristics for workers in the *informal sector* in addition to all non-agricultural workers.

4.2.4 The state level distributions of non-agricultural workers by their type of enterprise in which they were employed as obtained from the survey are presented in table 2.1.

4.3 Usual activity status of work

- 4.3.1 It may be of interest to obtain the proportion of non-agricultural workers engaged in the *informal sector* for different usual activity statuses of workers. Table 3 presents these proportions corresponding to different work statuses as well as for all non-agricultural workers excluding those casual workers engaged in public works.
- 4.3.2 It is seen from the table that among self-employed non-agricultural workers, about 91% in rural areas and 95% in urban areas reported to have worked in the *informal sector*. Among the non-agricultural workers who were casual labourers engaged in other than public works too, a substantial chunk was employed in the *informal sector* 69% in rural areas and 74% in urban areas. However, among regular salaried non-agricultural workers, fewer were employed in the *informal sector*: only 33% in rural areas and 40% in urban areas.

4.3.3 Table 4 shows the distributions at all-India level – separately for non-agricultural workers in general, and for workers in the *informal sector* in particular – over different activity statuses of such workers as obtained from the survey results. It would be of interest to study the features separately for rural and urban areas.

4.3.4 *In rural areas*: It is observed that the *self-employed* workers were more preponderant among those working in the *informal sector* (64%) than among all non-agricultural workers (50%). Within the *informal sector*, of the female workers, as many as 76% were self-employed while, among male workers, 60% were self-employed. Among all non-agricultural workers, proportions of selfemployed were a little lower than those working in the *informal sector*, these being 63% for females and 46% for males. The proportion of regular wage earners was lower among workers in the informal sector (11%) than that among all non-agricultural workers (25%).

4.3.5 In urban areas: The table shows that the proportion of self-employed workers in urban areas - whether among those working in the *informal sector* or among all non-agricultural workers - was lower than the corresponding proportions in rural areas. They were 57% among workers in the informal sector and 41% among all non-agricultural workers. In urban areas, unlike in rural areas, the proportion of regular wage earners – whether among workers in the *informal sector* or among all non-agricultural workers taken together – was much higher than that for casual labourers. While among all non-agricultural workers, proportion of regular wage earners and casual workers were estimated as 44% and 16% respectively, among workers in the *informal sector*, these estimates were 26% and 17% respectively.

4.3.6 The state level distribution of workers in the *informal sector* by their activity status as obtained from the survey are presented in table 4.1.

4.4 Broad industry of work

4.4.1 In would be interesting to know that corresponding to each broad industry of work (referred to as tabulation category, in consonance with the term used in the National Industrial Classification 1998), how many of the non-agricultural workers were accounted by the informal sector alone. Table 5 presents the proportions of *informal sector* workers among all non-agricultural workers separately for each tabulation category. The descriptions corresponding to each tabulation category is listed below the table.

4.4.2 Table 5 shows that more than four-fifths of all non-agricultural workers engaged in wholesale or retail trade etc (i.e. tabulation category G) or in hotels and restaurants (i.e. tabulation category H) belonged to the informal sector alone. This was true in rural or urban areas and even when male or female non-agricultural workers were considered separately. Among manufacturing workers (tabulation category D) also, the proportion of non-agricultural workers employed in the informal sector was quite significant – more so in rural than in urban areas. This proportion was more for females than for males. The survey has estimated that as high as 88% and 86% of females manufacturing workers were in the informal sector in rural and urban areas respectively. The corresponding estimates for males are 79% and 70% in rural and urban areas respectively. On the other hand, among real estate, renting and business workers (tabulation category K), the situation was just the reverse. Nearly 80% of urban and 75% of rural male workers in this tabulation category were in the *informal sector* while the corresponding proportions for female workers were 73% and 68% in urban and rural areas respectively.

- 4.4.3 Having formed an idea of the relative preponderance of *informal sector* workers among workers for each broad non-agricultural industry of work, it would be of interest to have a look into how *informal sector* workers in particular, and non-agricultural workers in general, are distributed over the various broad industries of work (i.e. tabulation category). Table 6 presents these distributions at the all-India level, separately for rural and urban areas.
- 4.4.4 In rural areas: The survey results suggest that manufacturing (tabulation category D) sector was the single most important provider of employment. The survey estimates that about 31% of the non-agricultural and 36% of the informal sector workers were employed in manufacturing activities. Most of the non-agricultural female workers (52%)- and those in the informal sector too, (61%) were engaged in manufacturing activities. For male workers, these proportions were less-26% for those engaged in all non-agricultural work and 29% for those in informal sector. Wholesale and retail trade etc. (tabulation category G) was also an important source of employment. About 19% of all non-agricultural workers and 24% of workers in informal sector were employed in such industries, the proportions being significantly higher for males than for females. Proportions of male workers engaged in wholesale and retail trade etc, was more than the corresponding proportions of female workers for all non-agricultural workers as well as for those in the informal sector.
- 4.4.5 *In urban areas:* Here, too, the same two broad industries of work were the main providers of employment in the non-agricultural sector -25% by *manufacturing (tabulation category D)* and 26% by *wholesale and retail trade etc,(tabulation category G)*. The broad features noted in rural areas regarding gender differentials for those engaged in *manufacturing* and *wholesale and retail trade etc* hold true here also for all non-agricultural workers as well as for those in the *informal sector*.
- 4.4.6 The state level distributions of workers in the *informal sector* by the broad industries of work (i.e. tabulation category) as obtained from the survey are presented in table 6.1.

4.5 Workers in manufacturing enterprises

- 4.5.1 As seen from the previous section, the category 'manufacturing' was the most important provider of employment in rural areas and was one of the most important one in urban areas. So, it would be of interest to take a further look at such activities.
- 4.5.2 An important aspect of any manufacturing enterprise is use of electricity for purposes of manufacturing. Table 7 presents the proportions of workers employed in such enterprises using electricity to all non-agricultural workers employed in such enterprises- separately for all manufacturing enterprises in the *informal sector* as well as for all manufacturing enterprises.

- 4.5.3 In rural areas: The survey estimates that a little less than a quarter (24%) of all workers in manufacturing enterprises were employed in those manufacturing units that used electricity for manufacturing purpose. The proportion was much higher for male workers (32%) than that for female workers (9%). This proportion was little lower – about 20% - for those working in informal However, when workers employed in manufacturing enterprises owned on a partnership basis are considered separately, this proportion was much higher (51%).
- 4.5.4 *In urban areas*: Here, the proportion of workers in *manufacturing* enterprises using electricity to all those working in manufacturing enterprises as a whole was almost double (50%) of that in rural areas. The feature observed in rural areas viz. of this proportion being a little lower for workers in informal sector as a whole but being much higher for workers in partnership owned manufacturing units holds true in urban areas too. In the latter case, the proportion was estimated to be as high as 74%. The feature of the proportion being much higher for male workers than that for female workers also holds true in urban areas, they being estimated as 57% and 22% respectively.

4.6 Location of work place

4.6.1 The various categories of location of work place for each of the working members of a sample household have been described earlier in chapter 2. Table 8 below presents the distribution of usual status non-agricultural workers – and separately for those who were working in enterprises in the informal sector only – by their location of work place. The description corresponding to each code of location of workplace used in the table are as follows:

1-no fixed place; workplace in rural areas: 2-own dwelling, 3-own enterprise/unit /office/shop but outside own dwelling, 4 – employer's dwelling, 5 – employer's enterprise/ unit /office/shop but outside employer's dwelling, 6 – street with fixed location, 7 – construction site, 8 – others; work place in urban areas: 9 – own dwelling, 10 – own enterprise/unit /office/shop but outside own dwelling, 11 – employer's dwelling, 12 – employer's enterprise/ unit /office/shop but outside employer's dwelling, 13 – street with fixed location, 14 – construction site, 15 – others

4.6.2 In rural areas: The table shows that for a very high proportion of non- agricultural workers residing in rural areas, their work place too was located in rural areas itself. The proportion for female workers was higher (84%) than that for male workers (74%). These proportions were even higher when employment in the informal sector alone is considered. For female workers employed in the informal sector alone the proportion was as high as 92%, the corresponding proportion for males being 82%. Female workers were more frequently found to be working in own dwelling and, to a lesser extent, in employer's enterprise etc. but outside employer's dwelling. However, for male workers, apart from these two categories, there were quite a number who worked in own enterprise etc. but outside own dwelling. The proportion of workers with no fixed work place was higher among males than among females. For all non-agricultural workers, these proportions were estimated as 8% and 3% for males and females respectively while for those working in the informal sector alone, the estimates are 10% and 4% for males and females respectively.

4.6.3 In urban areas: Among all non-agricultural workers residing in urban areas, about 81% are estimated to have their work place in urban areas itself. This proportion was slightly higher (83%) when workers employed in the *informal sector* were considered. The proportion for female workers was higher than that for male workers. Female non-agricultural workers worked much more frequently in their own dwelling in urban areas (25%) than their male counterparts (7%). The difference was even wider when the informal sector of non-agricultural employment was considered, the proportions being 36% for females and 11% for males. Other categories of work place where females worked with relatively higher frequency are employer's enterprise etc. but outside employer's dwelling in urban areas (29% among all enterprises and 18% among informal sector alone) and employer's dwelling in urban areas (10% among all enterprises and 12% among informal sector alone). On the other hand, male workers were to be most commonly found working in employer's enterprises etc. but outside employer's dwelling in urban areas (40% among all enterprises and 28% among *informal sector* alone). They were also working in relatively large numbers in own enterprises etc. but outside own dwelling in urban areas - 17% among all enterprises and 24% among enterprises within the *informal sector* alone. There were quite a few cases of non-reporting of the location of work place of workers in both rural and urban areas.

4.7 Maintenance of written accounts

4.7.1 The status of account of the enterprise for each working member of a sample household was recorded in this survey. The details have been described earlier in chapter 2. Special attention is given to those enterprises maintaining written accounts that were available and useable. Table 9 below presents the proportion of workers employed in enterprises maintaining such written accounts among non-agricultural workers. The table also presents the proportions separately for different types of enterprises.

- 4.7.2 Table 9 shows that the survey estimated about 20% of all non-agricultural workers in rural areas and 36% in urban areas were employed in enterprises that maintained written accounts. The proportion was higher for male workers (21% in rural and 38% in urban areas) than that for female workers (15% in rural and 29% in urban areas).
- 4.7.3 The table also shows that when workers employed in the *informal sector* only was considered, these proportions were much lower 11% in rural areas and 24% in urban areas. This was mainly due to very low proportions just 10% in rural and 21% in urban areas being observed for those working solely in the *proprietary* type of enterprise.

4.8 Self- employed non-agricultural workers

4.8.1 It would be of interest to probe into the self-employed component of the non-agricultural employment. This section tries to take a look into some aspects exclusively for the self-employed workers, such as their location of work place, number of workers who carried out production under the given product specification of the 'employer' for different locations of work place etc. 'Employer' in this context meant a person/enterprise who either directly or through some intermediary, gave out work to the workers carrying out work under the given product specification (see chapter 2, para 2.8 for details). For those self-employed who worked wholly or mainly under product specification, the type of provision for credit/raw material/equipments as well as various features like number of outlets (for the produce),basis of payment and type of order specification are also briefly discussed.

4.8.2 Location of work place

4.8.2.1 At first, the aspect of location of work place of the self-employed non-agricultural workers is looked into. Table 10 presents the distribution of such workers by location of their work place, separately for rural and urban areas.

4.8.2.2 *In rural areas:* Table 10 shows that about two-thirds of self-employed workers reported their location of work place as *own dwelling* or *own enterprise etc*, *but outside own dwelling*. The frequency with which females reported own dwelling as their location of work place (70%) was much higher than reported by males (32%). However, males reported their location of workplace as *own enterprise etc. but outside own dwelling* more frequently (30%) than that reported by females (11%). The proportions of self-employed workers reported their location of workplace as *no fixed place*, *street with fixed location* or *construction site* were rather low- 8%, 3% and 3% respectively.

4.8.2.3 *In urban areas*: Broadly speaking, the same features noted in rural areas are observed in urban areas too. In may be noted that very low proportion of self-employed workers, in rural or urban areas, reported their location of work place as *employer's dwelling* or *employer's enterprise etc. but outside employer's dwelling*.

4.8.3 Self-employed workers working wholly or mainly under product specification of the employer

4.8.3.1 In this sub-section, an attempt is made to study some features of those self-employed workers who carried out their work wholly or mainly under product specifications of the 'employer' (as stated earlier). At first, a look is taken into the proportions of such workers among the self-employed for each location of work place. Table 11 presents these figures, separately for rural and urban areas. The table shows that such non-agricultural workers comprised 22% of the self-employed in rural areas and 19% of the self-employed in urban areas.

4.8.3.2 *In rural areas*: Among female self-employed workers, working wholly or mainly under product specification was most frequently reported for those working in their *own dwelling* (46%), followed by those working at *construction site* (28%) and at their *employer's dwelling* (23%). Among males, the frequency was the highest for those working at their *employer's dwelling* (40%) followed by that for those working at *construction site* (33%) and in their *own dwelling* (25%). Overall, in rural areas, the frequency was the highest for those working at *employer's dwelling* (37%), followed by those working at *own dwelling* (35%) and then by those working at *construction site* (33%). About 40% of females with either *no fixed work place* or *in street with fixed location* or their work place located in their *own dwelling* or in their own *enterprise etc. but outside own dwelling* worked wholly or mainly under product specifications of the 'employer. The corresponding proportion for males was much lower at 17%.

4.8.3.3 *In urban areas*: Here, the percentage of self-employed workers who worked wholly or mainly under the product specification of the employer was the highest for those working at *construction site* (41%) followed by those working at *own dwelling* (33%) and then by those working at *employer's dwelling* (25%). The proportion for females was higher than that for males for those working in their *own dwelling* but lower than those for males working at *construction site* and at *employer's dwelling*. About 34% of females with either *no fixed work place* or *in street with fixed location* or their work place located in their *own dwelling* or in their own *enterprise etc. but outside own dwelling* worked wholly or mainly under product specifications of the 'employer. The corresponding proportion for males was much lower at 16%.

4.8.3.4 It would be of interest to know how many of those self-employed workers who were working wholly or mainly under product specification did so as per their *own arrangement* or were provided with some assistance by their 'employer' in one or more forms. These forms could be credit, raw materials or equipment. Table 12 presents these proportions separately for rural and urban areas.

4.8.3.5 *In rural areas*: Table 12 shows that *own arrangement* in respect of credit, raw materials or equipment was reported by about one third (33%) of all rural self-employed workers who worked wholly or mainly under product specification during 1999-2000. The proportion was much higher for male workers (47%) than that for females (14%). The table also shows that more than half (52%) of all such rural workers were provided with *raw materials only*, the percentage being much higher among female workers (74%) than among male workers (34%).

4.8.3.6 *In urban areas*: As a whole, in urban areas, the proportion of self-employed working wholly or mainly under product specification and making their *own arrangement* (42%) was higher than that for those being provided with *raw materials only* (39%). However, for such workers, among females, a much higher proportion were provided with *raw materials only* (64%) than those relying on *own arrangement* (21%). Among males, 51% made *own arrangement* while only 28% were provided with *raw materials only*.

4.8.3.7 One could also look into some other features of the self-employed who were working wholly or mainly under product specification of the employer. These could be the number of outlets of their ware, basis of their payment and the type of order specification laid by their 'employer'. Table 13 presents the proportions for each of these features.

- 4.8.3.8 Number of outlets: Table 13 shows that one outlet was most frequently reported in rural or urban areas. Among the self-employed working wholly or mainly under product specification, 67% in rural areas and 58% in urban areas reported just one outlet for their produce. The proportion of workers with one outlet was more for females than that for males.
- 4.8.3.9 Basis of payment: The table shows that piece rate formed the basis of payment for more than two-thirds of such workers in rural and urban areas. The proportions were much more for female workers - 81% in rural and 76% in urban areas - than for male workers, for whom the proportions were 64% in rural and 63% in urban areas.
- 4.8.3.10 Type of order specification: The table shows that in a vast majority of cases oral specification was reported. It was more so in rural areas where the proportion reporting oral specification was 86%. In urban areas this proportion was 76%. In rural or urban areas, the proportion was more for females – 92% in rural and 86% in urban areas – than for males, for whom the proportions were 81% in rural and 72% in urban areas.
