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# Introduction

## 1.1 Twenty Point Programme - 2006

**1.1.1** Alleviation of poverty and improving the quality of life of the people, especially of those who are below the poverty line, has been the prime objective of planned development in the country. Over the years, the meaning of economic development has shifted from growth in per capita income to the expansion of opportunities. The government, through various programmes/schemes, is helping its citizens to expand their capabilities. In order to achieve these objectives, package of programmes comprising schemes relating to Poverty Alleviation, Employment Generation, Education, Health, etc., called the Twenty Point Programme (TPP), has been in operation since 1975. In view of the changing scenario of the country over the years, the programme has been restructured thrice - in 1982, 1986 and 2006. The present programme now called Twenty Point Programme-2006 (TPP-2006) is in operation since April 2007.

**1.1.2** TPP-2006 has various points/items for the benefit of both the rural and urban people, taking cadre of all the requirements of the deprived and adversely affected population. TPP-2006 has 20 Points covering 65 items. These 65 items coincide with various programmes and schemes of the government which are administered by the Central Nodal Ministries/Departments and by and large are implemented through the State Governments/UT Administrations. The Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation has been given the responsibility of monitoring all the 65 items, of which some are reported on quarterly basis, and the others on annual basis. The details of 20 Points covering 65 items, the parameters under these 65 items, names of the nodal agencies and the frequency of reporting are available at the *Annexure*.

## 1.2 Monitoring Mechanism

**1.2.1** In order to effectively monitor the Twenty Point Programme, this Ministry has developed a Management Information System (MIS). The Management Information System (MIS) consists of a Quarterly Progress Report (QPR) and an Annual Report. The Quarterly Progress Report (QPR) covers monitoring of achievements in respect of the 10 crucial items (containing 16 items) against pre-set physical targets, whereas the Annual Report presents an analytical review of the performance of all the 65 items under the programme. The sources of information for the Annual Report are the Central Nodal Ministries and the State/UT Governments.

**1.2.2** All the States and the Union Territories of the country have a monitoring/evaluation unit under a nodal Department, which has been entrusted with the responsibility of monitoring all schemes/items covered under the Twenty Point Programme. The units have functionaries at block and district levels, to monitor and collect information for the different schemes of the Twenty Point Programme.

**1.2.3** Besides the monitoring done at the state level, individual scheme/ programme covered under TPP-2006 are also monitored by the Central Nodal Ministries concerned. The charter of this Ministry is to monitor the TPP-2006 as a whole in a holistic manner with a view to enhance its effectiveness.

### 9.1.3 Malaria:

#### 9.1.3.1 India has made considerable progress in reducing its malaria burden.

India achieved a reduction of 59% in malaria morbidity and 90% in malaria mortality between 2000 and 2018.

Thereby India achieved Goal 6 of the Millennium Development Goals (50-75% decrease in case incidence between 2000 and 2018).

Malaria cases have declined significantly by 49.09% and deaths due to malaria have been reduced by 50.51% in 2018 as compared to 2017.

### 9.1.4 LEPROSY

#### 9.1.4.1 NATIONAL LEPROSY ERADICATION PROGRAMME (NLEP):

The year 2017-18 started with 0.88 lakh leprosy cases on record as on 1 st April, 2017, with Prevalence Rate (PR) 0.67/10,000 population.

Till 31 st March, 2018, 29 States/ UTs had attained the level of leprosy elimination i.e., PR <1 case of leprosy/10,000 population and 572 districts (81.13%) out of total 705 districts also achieved elimination level.

#### 9.3.2 Routine immunisation comprising of DPT, Polio, BCG and Measles- Children

**Immunised:** There are three main systems to measure full immunization coverage:

1. Online web-based Health Management Information System (HMIS) portal wherein administrative coverage is being reported through health facilities across the country. As per HMIS data for 2017- 18, the full immunization coverage of the country stands at 86.7%.
2. Periodic surveys like National Family Health Survey (NFHS), District Level Household Survey (DLHS), Rapid Survey on Children (RSOC), Integrated Child Health and Immunization Survey (INCHIS) etc. As per the latest available survey, which is NFHS-4 conducted in 2015-16, the full immunization coverage in the country stands at 62%.
3. Concurrent monitoring of the UIP is conducted through session as well as community monitoring. As per concurrent monitoring data, the full immunization coverage in the country stands at 83%.

**9.3.3 Pulse Polio Immunisation Programme - Children Immunised:** Till March, 2019, around 8.89 crore doses of IPV have been administered to children across the country since its introduction.

**Panchayat Yuva Krida Aur Khel Abhiyan (PYKKA)** scheme was introduced as a nation-wide rural sports programme in the year 2008-09. **Rajiv Gandhi Khel Abhiyan Scheme (RGKA)**, a Centrally Sponsored Scheme, was introduced in 2014-15, expanding the erstwhile “Panchayat Yuva Krida Aur Khel Abhiyan (PYKKA)”. A new umbrella Scheme “**Khelo India**” was launched during the financial year 2016-17 after merger of existing scheme **Rajiv Gandhi Khel Abhiyan (RGKA)**, **Urban Sports Infrastructure Scheme (USIS)** and **National Sports Talent Search System Programme (NSTSSP)**.

**14.2 National Youth Corps (NYC):** National Youth Corps (NYC) Scheme was launched in country during the year 2010-11, encompassing the erstwhile '*Rashtriya Sadbhavana Yojana*', which is merged into a new 'umbrella' Scheme called "Rashtriya Yuva Sashaktikaran Karyakram RYSK)". Key points are:

As per the provision of the scheme, a total of 12,000 volunteers in 623 districts are being deployed every year.
There is a selection committee under Chairpersonship of DM/DC of the district for selecting volunteers. Volunteers in the age group of 18-29 years are being deployed for maximum period of 2 years duration only.
Each volunteer is being paid Rs. 5000/- as monthly honorarium with effect from October 2016 earlier each volunteer was being paid the monthly honorarium of Rs. 2500/- only.
During the year 2018-19, a total of 8294 volunteers were deployed across the country.

### **14.3 National Service Scheme (NSS):**

<b>National Service Scheme (NSS)</b> is one of the flagship programmes of Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports aimed at developing character and personality of student youth in schools and colleges. NSS was launched in the Birth Centenary Year of Mahatma Gandhi in 1969 in 37 Universities with about 40,000 students with primary focus on the development of personality of students through community service. The motto of the NSS is "Not me but You".
<b>Enrolment of NSS Volunteers:</b> As on 31.03.2019, NSS has about 39.96 lakh volunteers enrolled in 43,174 NSS units spread over 494 Universities and +2 Councils/Directorates, 17,894 Colleges/ Technical Institutions and 12,072 Senior Secondary Schools. Since inception, over 7 crore students have benefited from NSS.
<b>Adoption of Villages/ Slums:</b> During 2018-19, NSS units have adopted 39,156 villages/ slums for their activities.
<b>Special camping Programme:</b> During 2018-19, 38,132 Special Camps were organized in villages/ slums across India, involving 18,37,551 volunteers.

## 16.2 Prevention of Pollution of Rivers and Water Bodies:

National River Conservation Plan for 34 rivers - Sewerage plants set up: Sewage Treatment Capacity of 187 mld was targeted to be created under NRCP during the year 2018-19 (September, 2018) against which, 48.00 mld has been created so far during the year.

Presently NRCP (excluding Ganga and its tributaries) has covered polluted stretches of 33 rivers in 76 towns spread over 15 States at a sanctioned cost of Rs.4801.57 crore.

An amount of Rs. 2337.73 crore has been released to various State Governments for implementation of various pollution abatement schemes and a treatment capacity of 2520.43 million litres per day (mld) has been created so far under NRCP (excluding Ganga and its tributaries).

## 16.3 Solid and liquid Waste Management in Rural Areas and Urban Areas:

The Tamil Nadu Model of Solid Waste Management and the Telangana Model of Liquid Waste Management were studied by Senior Officials of 10 States. After this study, a Write-shop was organized and facilitated by DAY- NRLM to develop suitable proposals to initiate SLWM in rural areas in India. Accordingly, six States have developed their proposal, viz., Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal and received EC approval. These projects were rolled-out from January 2017. *(Source: Annual Report 2018-19 of Ministry of Rural Development)*

Under Swachh Bharat Mission, as on 31.03.2019, 76,101 wards (out of the total 84,420 wards) are covered by 100% door-to-door collection. 53.19% of the total waste generated is currently being processed, and 62.87% of wards (53,076 wards) are practicing source segregation. *(Source: Annual Report 2018-19 of Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs)*

Under Swachh Bharat Mission, currently, there are 685 functional waste to compost plants (centralized) with capacity to process 189 lakh tonnes waste per annum, and another 232 plants are under construction, with approx. input capacity of 46.6 lakhs tonnes per annum. Additionally, there are 2 functional RDF plants with input capacity of 3.1 lakh tonnes per annum, and 30 bio gas and bio-methanation plants are functional. 7 waste to electricity plants are functional with input capacity of over 20.8 lakh tonnes per annum and output capacity of 88.4 MW, and 56 waste to electricity plants are under construction with output capacity of 415 MW. There are currently 6 functional C&D plants with input capacity of 12.92 lakh tonnes per annum and 3 C&D Plants are under construction. *(Source: Annual Report 2018-19 of Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs)*

## 19.6 Supply of Kerosene and LPG:

**19.6.1 Kerosene:** Key features - Allocation of Kerosene in States, and Stock of Kerosene lifted and distributed:

The allocation for the year 2018-19 has been further reduced by 12% in comparison to the allocation of 2017-18.

Over and above the above reduction in the PDS Kerosene allocations, till date, 12 State Governments/UTs (Karnataka, Haryana, Telangana, Nagaland, Chandigarh, Gujarat, Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Goa, Puducherry, Rajasthan and Maharashtra) have voluntarily surrendered their PDS kerosene allocations under DBTK Scheme.

As on date, 8 State Governments/UTs have already cut down their PDS Kerosene allocation to nil.

### 19.6.2 LPG: LPG Consumers and Quantity of LPG distributed to dealers

There were 23.28 crore LPG consumers joined under the PAHAL - Direct Benefits Transfer for LPG (DBTL) scheme (as on 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2018).

More than 3.05 crore new LPG connections have been released as on 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2018 in the FY 2018-19 which is more than the number of LPG connections released in the FY 2017-18 (2.81 crore). LPG coverage as per active customer count based on 2011 Census has increased in the country from 80.9% (as on 01.04.2018) to 89.9% (as on 31.12.2018).

There are 191 LPG Bottling Plants operated by Public Sector Oil Marketing Companies and 22,654 LPG Distributorships in the country as on 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2018

Total 2,530 new LPG distributorships have been commissioned from 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2018 to 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2018 and 2,592 Letter of Intents (LOI) have been issued by OMCs to set up new distributorships.

**20.1** With a view to develop the backward areas in the country, the item titled “Backward Regions Grant Fund (BRGF)” was kept under Twenty Point Programme for monitoring.
