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# Introduction

## 1.1 Twenty Point Programme - 2006

**1.1.1** Alleviation of poverty and improving the quality of life of the people, especially of those who are below the poverty line, has been the prime objective of planned development in the country. Over the years, the meaning of economic development has shifted from growth in per capita income to the expansion of opportunities. The government, through various programmes/schemes, is helping its citizens to expand their capabilities. In order to achieve these objectives, package of programmes comprising schemes relating to Poverty Alleviation, Employment Generation, Education, Health, etc., called the Twenty Point Programme (TPP), has been in operation since 1975. In view of the changing scenario of the country over the years, the programme has been restructured thrice - in 1982, 1986 and 2006. The present programme now called Twenty Point Programme-2006 (TPP-2006) is in operation since April 2007.

**1.1.2** TPP-2006 has various points/items for the benefit of both the rural and urban people, taking cadre of all the requirements of the deprived and adversely affected population. TPP-2006 has 20 Points covering 65 items (*Annexure-1*). These 65 items coincide with various programmes and schemes of the government which are administered by the Central Nodal Ministries/Departments and by and large are implemented through the State Governments/UT Administrations. The Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation has been given the responsibility of monitoring all the 65, of which some are reported on quarterly basis, and the others on annual basis. The details of 20 Points covering 65 items, the parameters under these 65 items, names of the nodal agencies and the frequency of reporting are available in *Annexure-1*.

## 1.2 Monitoring Mechanism

**1.2.1** In order to effectively monitor the Twenty Point Programme, this Ministry has developed a Management Information System (MIS). The Management Information System (MIS) consists of a Quarterly Progress Report (QPR) and an Annual Report. The Quarterly Progress Report (QPR) covers monitoring of achievements in respect of the 13 crucial items (containing 19 parameters) against pre-set physical targets, whereas the Annual Report presents an analytical review of the performance of all the 65 items under the programme. The sources of information for the Annual Report are the Central Nodal Ministries and the State/UT Governments.

**1.2.2** All the States and the Union Territories of the country have a monitoring/evaluation unit under a nodal Department, which has been entrusted with the responsibility of monitoring all schemes/items covered under the Twenty Point Programme. The units have functionaries at block and district levels, to monitor and collect information for the different schemes of the Twenty Point Programme.



**1.2.3** Besides the monitoring done at the state level, individual scheme/ programme covered under TPP-2006 are also monitored by the Central Nodal Ministries concerned. The charter of this Ministry is to monitor the TPP-2006 as a whole in a holistic manner with a view to enhance its effectiveness.

**4.2 Marketing and Infrastructural Support to Farmers:** The Government has been playing an important role in developing Agriculture Marketing system in the country. There is a need to enhance private sector investment in development of post-harvest marketing infrastructure for which various schemes are also implemented.

**4.2.1 Agricultural Marketing Reforms:**

Since inspection of the Grameen Bhandaran Yojana (GBY) from 01.04.2001 and up to 31.12.2016, a total number of 37,574 godowns having a capacity of 630.94 lakh MT have been sanctioned and subsidy of Rs. 2,405.78 crore has been released. The target for the XII plan is 230.00 lakh MT and the achievement during the XII Plan up to December, 2016 is 313.77 lakh MT.

Since inception of AMIGS from 20.10.2004 upto 31.12.2016 a total of 18,331 projects have been sanctioned and subsidy of Rs. 1,621.02 crores has been released. The target for the XII plan is 4000 projects and the achievement during XII plan upto December, 2016 is 9499 projects. Presently the AMI scheme is not available for the promoters of General Category other than North Eastern Region from 05.08.2014 due to paucity of funds. For promoters of SC, ST categories and north eastern regions, the scheme is not available from 31.12.2016.

**4.3 Irrigation Facilities (including Minor and Micro Irrigation) for Agriculture**

**4.3.1 Micro Irrigation for Agriculture:**

During 2016-17, as on 31st December, 2016, an amount of Rs. 1211.75 cr and Rs.430.30 crore has been released to states for implementation of Micro-irrigation activities and for Other Interventions activities respectively.

Till December, 2016, an area of about 3.54 lakh ha. has been covered under Micro Irrigation.

### 4.3.2 Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana - Accelerated Irrigation Benefits Programme – Coverage of Minor Irrigation:

Since its inception, 297 Irrigation / Multi Purpose Projects have been included for funding under AIBP. Out of this 143 projects have been completed and 5 projects were foreclosed.
An irrigation potential of 24.39 Lakh ha has been created through these completed projects.
The cumulative Central Loan Assistance / Grant provided to States under AIBP to all of above project till 31.3.2015 was Rs. 67539.52 crore. Twenty five States got benefited from the programme.
Under Accelerated Irrigation Benefits Programme, the State Governments have been provided an amount of Rs. 58503.70 crore as CLA/Grant under AIBP (MMI) since its inception till March 2016-17.
After commencement of this Programme, 143 major/medium irrigation projects have been completed and 5 were foreclosed out of 297 projects taken up under the programme so far. The irrigation potential of 85.54 lakh hectare has been created through major/medium AIBP projects. During 2016-17, Central Assistance (CA) of Rs.3308 crore has been provided to various projects under AIBP.

**5.1 Social Security for Agricultural and Unorganized Labour:** The term “unorganized labour” has been defined as those workers who have not been able to organize themselves in pursuit of their common interests due to certain constraints such as casual nature of employment, ignorance and illiteracy, small and scattered size establishments, etc.

As per Census 2011, there are about 36.25 crore workers in the country, but only a small segment of the organized work-force is covered by some form of social security. For the rest, a job is the best guarantee for social security right now.

‘The Unorganized Workers’ Social Security Act, 2008 was enacted on 31.12.2008, followed by the framing of Unorganized Workers’ Social Security Rules, 2009. The Act has come into force w.e.f. 16.05.2009.

## **7.1 Rural Housing - Pradhan Mantri Awaas Yojana (Grameen)**

### **7.1.1 Physical and Financial Performance during 2016-17:**

Against an allocation of Rs. 15,000 crore for the scheme (including 5% set aside for Special Projects) of Pradhan Mantri Awaas Yojana - Gramin (PMAY-G) for the year 2016-17, Ministry has released an amount of Rs. 14,289.96 crore (as on 31st Dec. 2016).

Out of this, funds of Rs 4645.31 crore have been utilized by the States/UT during the year 2016-17. 1.68 crore beneficiaries have been identified based on SECC-2011 data as eligible to receive assistance under PMAY-G after due verification by Gram Sabha and review by Appellate Authority.

A total of 21.18 lakh houses have been constructed during 2016-17.

- And On 27 March 2014, the 4<sup>th</sup> WHO South-East Asia Region was certified polio-free, meaning that transmission of wild poliovirus has been interrupted in this block of 11 countries including Bangladesh, Bhutan, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, **India**, Indonesia, Maldives, Myanmar, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Thailand and Timor-Leste.

**9.6 Two Child Norms:** Intra Uterine contraceptive Devices (IUCD): Copper containing IUCDs are used for long term spacing of child birth. Two types of IUCDs are used under Family Planning programme;

- Cu IUCD 380 A (effective for 10 years)
- Cu IUCD 375 (effective for 5 years)

Sterilization: The following method can be used by either of the couple and are permanent in nature i.e. considered to be irreversible

- Female sterilization: There are two types currently used in India, MinilapTubectomy and Laparoscopic female sterilization
- Male sterilization: Two types are currently used in India, conventional and Non scalpel Vasectomy. Non scalpel vasectomy involve puncturing instead of incision, thus avoiding the need for stitches.

#### National Scheduled Tribes Finance and Development Corporation (NSTFDC)

<b>a) Sanctions:</b> During the year 2016-17, National Scheduled Tribes Finance and Development Corporation (NSTFDC) has sanctioned financial assistance of Rs. 131.97 crore for 43,965 beneficiaries as on 31.12.2016. NSTFDC set a target of Rs 200 crore for sanctions during the year.
The sanctioned financial assistance includes sanction of Rs. 73 crore under Adivasi Mahila Sashaktikaran Yojana (AMSY) for 31461 women beneficiaries.
Further it is estimated that sanction of Rs. 68 crore will be achieved during the period January to March, 2017.
<b>b) Disbursement:</b> The disbursement target for the year 2016-17 is Rs 195 crore. As on 31.12.2016, the Corporation has released Rs 62.61 crore for implementation of sanctioned schemes benefitting 40958 beneficiaries. This includes, disbursement of Rs 56.32 crore under Term Loan.
Further it is estimated that sanction of Rs. 133 crore will be achieved during the period January to March, 2017.
<b>c) Recovery:</b> The cumulative recovery is 86.56% as on 31.12.2016.

**14.1 Sports for all in Rural and Urban Areas:** Panchayat Yuva Krida Aur Khel Abhiyan (PYKKA) scheme was introduced as a nation-wide rural sports programme in the year 2008-09. Rajiv Gandhi Khel Abhiyan Scheme (RGKA), a Centrally Sponsored Scheme, was introduced in 2014-15, expanding the erstwhile “Panchayat Yuva Krida Aur Khel Abhiyan (PYKKA)”. A new umbrella Scheme “**Khelo India**” was launched during the financial year 2016-17 after merger of existing scheme **Rajiv Gandhi Khel Abhiyan (RGKA)**, **Urban Sports Infrastructure Scheme (USIS)** and **National Sports Talent Search System Programme (NSTSSP)**.

**14.1.1 Financial Implementation of the Khelo India Scheme:**

The allocation made during the current financial year 2016-17 for the Khelo India is Rs. 140 crore
For holding Annual Competitions during 2016-17 a sum of Rs. 43.96 crore has been sanctioned/released.
For infrastructure development a sum of Rs. 64.10 crore has been sanctioned/released.
UCs for an amount of Rs. 17.70 crore are outstanding under RGKA scheme and for Rs. 10.23 are outstanding under PYKKA Scheme. Efforts are being made to settle the outstanding UCs against both schemes.

**14.2 National Youth Corps (NYC):** National Youth Corps (NYC) Scheme was launched in country during the year 2010-11, encompassing the erstwhile ‘*Rashtriya Sadbhavana Yojana*’, which is merged into a new ‘umbrella’ Scheme called “**Rashtriya Yuva Sashaktikaran Karyakram (RYSK)**”. Key points are:

As per the provision of the scheme, a total of 12,000 volunteers in 623 districts are being deployed every year.
There is a selection committee under Chairpersonship of DM/DC of the district for selecting volunteers. Volunteers in the age group of 18-29 years are being deployed for maximum period of 2 years duration only.
Each volunteer is being paid Rs. 5000/- as monthly honorarium with effect from October 2016 earlier each volunteer was being paid the monthly honorarium of Rs- 2500/- only.
During the year 2016-17, a total of 10081 volunteers were deployed across the country.

### 14.3 National Service Scheme (NSS):

**National Service Scheme (NSS)** is one of the flagship programmes of Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports aimed at developing character and personality of student youth in schools and colleges. NSS was launched in the Birth Centenary Year of Mahatma Gandhi in 1969 in 37 Universities with about 40,000 students with primary focus on the development of personality of students through community service. The motto of the NSS is “Not me but You”.

**Enrolment of NSS Volunteers:** As on 31.03.2016, NSS had about 36.58 lakh volunteers enrolled in 39,695 NSS units spread over 391 Universities/ +2 Councils, 16,278 Colleges/ Technical Institutions and 12,483 Senior Secondary Schools.

**Adoption of Villages/ Slums:** During 2016-17 (upto 31.12.2016), NSS units have adopted 20,497 villages/ slums for their activities.

**Special camping Programme:** During 2016-17 (upto 31.12.2016), 4,739 Special Camps were organized in villages/ slums across India, involving 2,50,703 volunteers.

### 16.3 Solid and liquid Waste Management:

The Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban) has two primary components of implementation: achieving 100% open defecation free status, and 100% scientific processing of solid waste - in all 4,041 ULBs in the country.

The SBM guidelines were revised this year to provide higher flexibility to the States/ULBs to determine their own sanitation infrastructure targets, inclusion of Public Toilets in the purview of central assistance for grants, increased base grant for Community/Public Toilets seats, from Rs 65,000 to Rs 98,000 per seat, and increased of grant for Solid Waste Management projects from 20% to 35%.

As on date, two states - Gujarat and Andhra Pradesh, and one UT - Chandigarh-have become Open Defecation Free. A total of 545 cities / towns have declared themselves ODF (487 during 2016-17), while 468 among them have been certified ODF through third party certification. 739 ULBs are poised to become ODF by March 2017.

31,179 wards have become ODF till 2016. This has been made possible through the construction of 16.34 lakh individual household toilets - IHHLs - this year (total 29.18 lakh IHHL till December, 2016). Additionally, 43,465 seats of community and public toilets have been constructed this year (total 1.10 lakh seats till December, 2016).

Till December, 2016, 39,995 wards (out of the total 81,015 wards) are covered by 100% door-to-door collection. 21.51% of the total waste generated (1,57,478 MT/ day) is currently being processed.

Currently, there are 7 functional waste-to-energy plants and 45 waste-to-compost plants that are operational across the country. Additionally, 22 WTE plants and 283 WTC are under construction / under tendering.

<p>The Government, vide notification dated 29th June, 2017, has allowed for direct sale of Biodiesel (B-100) for blending with High Speed Diesel to all consumers, in accordance with the specified blending limits and the standards specified by the Bureau of Indian Standards. Pursuant, OMCs and concerned Ministries have been requested on 9.8.2017 to take appropriate action for implementation of the said order.</p>
<p>Recently, the work related to bio-fuels has been transferred from Ministry of New &amp; Renewable Energy to Ministry of Petroleum &amp; Natural Gas. To spur growth in Bio-fuel industry, this Ministry has initiated the process of formulating the National Policy on Bio-fuels – 2018 and is planning to come up with a scheme to incentivize setting up of 2G (second generation) Ethanol Bio-refineries based on crop residues and Municipal Solid Waste (MSW).</p>
<p>The Government, vide notification dated 29 th June, 2017, has allowed direct sale of Biodiesel (B-100) for blending with High Speed Diesel to all consumers, in accordance with the specified blending limits and the standards specified by the Bureau of Indian Standards.</p>
<p>During the period April-November, 2017 Biodiesel quantity procured was 43551 KL vis-à-vis 34910 KL procured during the same period in 2016 i.e. increase of 24%.</p>

## 19.6 Supply of Kerosene and LPG:

**19.6.1 Kerosene:** Key features - Allocation of Kerosene in States, and Stock of Kerosene lifted and distributed:

Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance, had recommended reduction of 19.7% with a cut of 10% minimum and 25% maximum in quota allocation to States/UTs for the year 2016-17 over the allocation of 2015-16. Accordingly, PDS SKO allocation to the States/UTs has been rationalized for the year 2016-17.

However, in view of the peculiar geographical / security situation and logistics constraints the allocation of PDS SKO to North Eastern States (North East namely, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland and Tripura) and Jammu and Kashmir, reduction in PDS quota to these States has been restricted to 10% only over year 2015-16.

Upto 4th Quarter of 2016-17, a total allocation of 69,31,872 KL has been made to the States/UTs.

### 19.6.2 LPG: LPG Consumers and Quantity of LPG distributed to dealers

During 2016-17, more than 3.31 crore new LPG connections have been released.

In the Public Sector, there are 188 LPG Bottling Plants, 18390 LPG Distributorships in the country as on 30.11.2016.

As on 05.12.2016, 448 Nos. of new LPG distributorships have been commissioned by OMCs in year 2016-17. 954 Letter of Intents (LOI) were issued by OMCs in 2016-17 as on 05.12.2016.

Government of India has launched Direct Benefit Transfer for LPG consumer (DBTL) scheme namely, 'PAHAL', in 54 districts of the country on 15.11.2014 and as on 29.11.2016, 17 Crore LPG consumers have joined the scheme.
