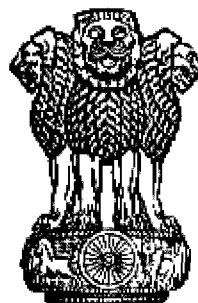

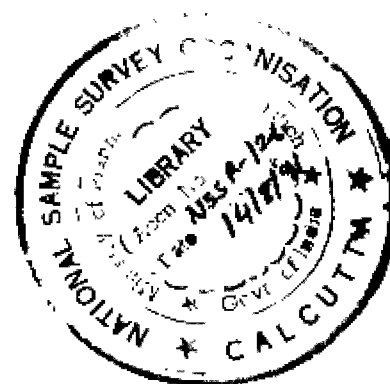

CHAPTER ONE

SCOPE, COVERAGE AND METHOD

1.1. This report on internal migration is based on the data collected in the National Sample Survey (NSS) fourteenth and fifteenth rounds along with the Employment and Unemployment enquiries. The earlier report on the subject—covering the NSS ninth, eleventh, twelfth and thirteenth rounds—'The National Sample Survey, Number 53'—was published in 1962.

1.2. A set of different concepts and definitions were taken up for the study of internal migration in the NSS rounds concerned.

1.3. From the tables presented in the report the general rate of stability of population, rate of rural to urban migration and the rate of inter district migration can be derived. Inflating these rates with the appropriate population, the quantitative estimates about different types of population movement will be obtained.

1.4. The whole of urban areas of India excluding Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Amindive and Laccadive Islands and the North East Frontier Agency were brought under the geographical coverage of the survey.

Concepts and Definitions

1.5. *Household*.—A household had been defined as consisting of a person or a group of persons who normally pass nights under the same roof and ordinarily take food from the same kitchen. Each independent boarder of hostels or boarding houses was considered as a separate household in the NSS. Thus, for the enquiry on employment and unemployment and migration, only normally resident members (which excluded guests and included temporary absentees) were considered in determining the household size.

1.6. The volume of internal migration is dependent on the extent of the geographical area in relation to which the term is defined. The volume will be small when the geographical area chosen is large because many small movements within the area will not be considered as events of migration. Careful attention was paid to this point and the geographical area chosen to collect immigration particulars for the NSS rounds was a village or a town. Provision was also made to record the state, district and area (rural or urban) from where the migrants came so that the volume of inter-district, inter-state or rural-urban migration might also be easily obtained.

1.7. *Native place*.—The native place is generally the place where the parents or forefathers of a person reside or resided more or less permanently and with which the person has or had at least some occasional connection. When the informant was enumerated at a place other than this, he was treated as an in-migrant at the place of enumeration. The native place of a married woman denoted the native place prior to her marriage.

1.8. *Previous place of residence*.—The previous place of residence is the place where the person had been residing more or less permanently prior to coming to the place of enumeration.

1.9. *NSS fourteenth round*.—Two different criteria were used for determining the migration status of a person : (i) if the place (village/town) where the person was enumerated was different from the native place (village/town) then the person was considered as an in-migrant and (ii) according to this definition a person was considered as an in-migrant if the person's usual place of residence 365 days preceding the day of enquiry was different from the place of enumeration.

1.10. *NSS fifteenth round*.—A person for whom the place (village/town) of enumeration was different from the native place (village/town) was considered to be an in-migrant in this round also. The second definition used was the 'previous usual place of residence'. That is, a person would be considered as an in-migrant according to this definition, provided the person changed usual place (village/town) of residence at least once during his lifetime. Particulars about the last place of residence were only collected.

1.11. This report is based on the information available from the urban samples only. The NSS fourteenth round survey was conducted through a period of one year—commencing at the beginning of the month of July 1958 and terminating at the end of the month of June 1959. Altogether 7587 sample households selected from 2216 sample blocks were surveyed. In the fifteenth round the set of households selected for the NSS fourteenth round were resurveyed with necessary substitution. A total number of 7621 households were surveyed in the fifteenth round. Details of coverage, statewide allocation of samples and procedure for substitution are given in Appendix I.

CHAPTER TWO

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

2.1. Some of the important findings are presented in this chapter.

Residence one year ago

2.2. The place of residence one year ago was different from the place of enumeration for 357 persons out of 10000 residents in urban areas. This rate of mobility includes movements from rural to urban areas, from one town to another and from other countries to urban India. The rate of in-migration in big cities was about 207 per 10000 which was rather slow compared to the corresponding rates of 391 and 372 for towns with population three lakhs and above, and other urban areas respectively. About 47 per cent of the in-migrants in urban areas came from rural areas [Table 1-3].

2.3. Most of the in-migrants belonged to the age band 18 to 36 years with high concentration in the age group 18-21 years, indicating high rate of mobility at the age at entry in labour force [Table 5].

Previous place of residence

2.4. Of the total urban population of India about 41 per cent were in-migrants in the sense that each of them had been residing previously at a place (village/town) which was different from the city/town where he/she had been enumerated. More than half of the male population in big cities were in-migrants while the corresponding proportion was slightly less than one third for small towns [Tables 10 & 11].

2.5. It was observed that the proportion of in-migrants was higher amongst people with higher level of educational standard. For illiterate persons the proportion was 36.20 per cent and it gradually increased to 65.17 per cent for graduates and others with higher educational qualifications. Of course, the wide divergence in the proportion cannot be totally attributed to the level of educational attainment alone; to a certain extent this divergence might also be explained by the difference in age structure between the two groups of population [Table (12)].

2.6. Amongst the in-migrants 3.39 per cent came within one year, 8.33 per cent within 2 years and 24.71 per cent within 5 years. In big cities the proportion of in-migrants within 8 years was comparatively lower. It perhaps, reflected the slower rate of in-migration in big cities in the recent years [Tables 13—14].

2.7. A study of the place of origin for the in-migrants revealed that 57.40 per cent of them came from rural areas, 19.49 per cent from different states and 8.50 per cent from Pakistan [Table 17].

SAMPLE DESIGN AND ESTIMATION PROCEDURE

1.1 *NSS Fourteenth Round*.—The portion of the survey designed for the urban areas covered the whole of urban areas in Indian Union excluding the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Amindive and Laccadive Islands and the North-East Frontier Agency.

1.2 *Stratification*.—Each city with a population of 3 lakhs and above as well as each capital town of the former part 'A' and part 'B' states except Shillong, the capital of Assam was taken as a separate stratum. In the case of Greater Calcutta eight strata were formed, in view of greater heterogeneity of population. In Jammu & Kashmir, Jammu town was considered as a separate strata besides Srinagar. In the rest of the urban area, towns within natural division formed separate strata. There was altogether 94 strata in the whole of Indian Union.

1.3 *Selection of urban blocks*.—All towns in each natural division were arranged according to their means of livelihood pattern. Within each town the census blocks were arranged according to their geographical nearness. With this arrangement of towns and blocks, four circular systematic samples were drawn with four independent random starts to form four independent sub-samples. Out of these four sub-samples, one party of investigators covered sub-sample 1 during the first six months and sub-sample 3 during the last six months and similarly another party of investigators covered sub-samples 2 and 4.

1.4 *Procedure of estimation*.—For any sub-sample defining the symbols

Now the number 'n_i's were so selected as to make the factor

The 94 strata were divided into six groups and for each group one such constant multiplier was used, hence

where M_c is the constant multiplier for the cth group of strata.

1.5 *NSS fifteenth round*.—In the NSS fifteenth round, the households in a sample block were listed afresh. Against each household listed, a 'stability code' was given. This code was introduced for properly indentifying the households listed in the NSS fourteenth round. Codes were provided to indicate whether a household listed in the fourteenth round since shifted to a different house within the same urban block, left the sample block, merged with another household, partitioned to form two or more households, now extinct due to death of the member/s of the household. A separate code was provided for those households which were listed in the fourteenth round and existed at the same place in the fifteenth round also.

1.6 All the households formed as a result of splitting of a sample household surveyed in the fourteenth round were to be surveyed in the fifteenth round, treating each of those as a separate household. If a fourteenth round sample household merged with another sample or other household, information were to be collected from each member of the merged household in the fifteenth round. If as the result of splitting of a sample household one or more component left the sample block, then the schedule was to be canvassed only in those components which remained within the block. No fresh sample was selected from the new households listed. Any sample household leaving the block was substituted by the household having the succeeding sample household serial number.

1.7 Since the eighth round of the NSS, the States have begun to participate in the work of the NSS. The States of Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Bombay, Kerala, Orissa, Punjab and Uttar Pradesh participated in the work of the NSS on a full matching basis and the State of Madhya Pradesh on half-matching basis during the fifteenth round.

1.8 Table(1.1) shows the statewise allocation of sample blocks.
