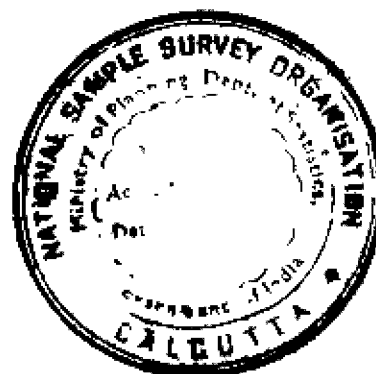

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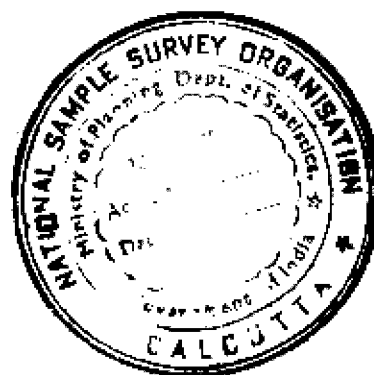
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ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

CHAPTER ONE

INTRODUCTION

1.1 Information on housing condition is being collected through National Sample Survey (NSS) since seventh round alongwith the enquiry on Household Consumer Expenditure. Reports on the data collected during seventh, tenth, eleventh and twelfth rounds have already been published.¹ No information was collected during thirteenth and fourteenth rounds. After a gap of two rounds, data on housing condition were collected again with greater details during the fifteenth round (July 1959—June 1960) through Household Schedule 1.0 : Consumer Expenditure.² A separate block 18 on housing condition containing 28 items was introduced. This report deals with some of the important items.

1.2 The collection of the data was confined to household sector. Even in the household sector only the residential houses occupied by the household were covered. Non-household establishments were outside the scope of the survey. The data were collected by method of interrogation.

1.3 The survey was conducted both in rural and urban areas of the entire country excluding Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Laccadive and Amindive Islands, Ladakh districts of Jammu and Kashmir and North East Frontier Agency.

1.4 Altogether 7700 households from 2598 sample villages in rural areas and 2201 households from 2213 blocks in urban areas were selected for survey in this round.

1.5 The survey was started in the month of July 1959 and it continued till the end of June 1960.

1.6 The usual techniques of interpenetrating net work of sub-samples (IPNS) was employed at field as well as tabulation stages. In this report estimates are given for two independent and interpenetrating sub-samples (each providing equally valid estimates) and also for the combined sample.

1.7 The estimates are presented at all India level only.

1.8 The results are given broadly under two aspects of the condition of housing of family households namely, accommodation (floor space, the number of rooms occupied and type of dwelling) amenities and sanitary facilities such as type of bath, latrine and lighting and source of drinking water, distance from the source of drinking water.

1.9 The report gives mainly percentage distributions of total number of households or persons under different classifications relating to various aspects of housing condition. Most tables are in the form of two way distributions, taking two classificatory characters at one time.

1.10 In some cases because of inadequacy of sample size in some cells, the cell estimates are subject to large margin of error. These estimates should be used with caution.

1.11 About the tables presented in the report, it may be pointed out that the tables given in the text in chapter two are serially numbered without any prefix. Tables given in the Appendices are indicated by an alphabet A, B or C in the beginning of the table number. The alphabet refers to the Appendix to which it belongs. For instance, Table (A.1.1) and Table (B.1.1) belong to Appendix A and Appendix B respectively. For further details about the tables, explanatory notes to the tables may be referred to.

1.12 The concepts and definitions followed in this round were more or less same as followed in earlier rounds. The discussion for each item is given in Appendix D : "Extracts from Instructions to Field Workers".

1.13 The report is divided into two chapters. The second chapter deals briefly with the summary of results.

1.14 Five appendices are attached to the report, the first of which (Appendix A) gives statistical tables with explanatory notes on the tables and the second (Appendix B) gives briefly the design of the survey and procedure of estimation adopted. The validity of the results is discussed in Appendix C. Extracts from Instructions to the Field Workers are given in Appendix D and facsimile of the schedule of enquiry in Appendix E.

CHAPTER TWO

SUMMARY OF RESULTS

2.0 Important aspects of the housing condition in the country as revealed by this survey are discussed here with the help of summary tables. These tables are derived from the marginal totals of the tables of Appendix A. However, for some points reference has to be made to a few two-way tables of Appendix A. As in these discussions, interest is centred on actual estimates rather than variability, only the combined estimates are examined.

2.1 *Household size and a number of rooms occupied.*—About 39 percent of the households in rural areas and about 49 percent in the urban areas lived in one room only. Further, the percentage of households living in not more than two rooms was as high as 71 in rural and 78 in urban areas. Table (1) shows the percentage distributions of number of households and persons by number of rooms occupied.

The table shows that the percentage of households and persons decreased with increase of number of rooms. There was high concentration or overcrowding of persons in one or two rooms. This concentration was much more pronounced in urban areas than in rural areas.

2.2 *Number of persons per room.*—Average number of persons per room in rural and urban areas was found to be 2.32 and 2.34 respectively.

Table (2) gives estimated average number of persons per room by household size. The table shows that the average number of persons per room increased with an increase in household size in both rural and urban areas. It is seen that concentration of number of persons per room was highest in the last group both in rural and urban areas i.e. for the household size group 9 and above (3.00 and 3.50 persons per room in rural and urban areas respectively).

2.3 *Household floor space.*—About 72 percent of the households in rural areas had not more than 100 square feet of living space per person and corresponding figure for urban areas was 74 percent. Table (3) gives percentage distribution of households and persons by per capita floor space.

The table shows that about 43 percent of the persons in rural areas and 55 percent in urban areas had less than 50 square feet per person for dwelling purposes.

Analysing the percentage of households by per capita floor space and by monthly household expenditure levels, it is found that per capita floor space increased with household expenditure. Of course, percentage of households in the higher classes of both these characteristics were extremely small. [Tables (A1.15) to (A1.17) and Tables (A2.15) to (A2.17)]

2.4 *Estimated floor space per person.*—Actual estimates of per capita floor space are given in Table (4). Estimated floor space per person for the households in rural and urban areas was about 81 and 70 square feet respectively. The estimated average floor space per person for households with size 1 was maximum for both rural (235.73 sq. ft.) and urban (249.35 sq. ft.) areas. It is noted that per capita floor space fell steeply from household size group 1 to household size group 2 by about 93 and 129 square feet in rural and urban areas respectively. The table also reveals that floor space per person decreased with increase in household size. It was as low as 65 square feet in rural areas and 48 square feet in urban areas for the household size group "9 and above".

2.5 *Type of dwelling.*—Table (5) gives percentage distribution of households and number of persons by type of dwelling.

It is found that about 70 percent of households in rural areas and about 49 percent in urban areas had independent houses. Still a considerable percentage of households lived in chawls and bustees (about 19% in rural areas and about 28% in urban areas). Flats were not very common in rural areas (2%). Comparatively, larger number of households occupied flats in urban areas (8%).

2.6 *Bath room.*—Table (6) gives the percentage distribution of households and number of persons by type of bath rooms.

About 92 percent of the households in rural areas and about 67 percent in urban areas did not have any bath room. Only 6 percent of the households in rural areas and about 19 percent in urban areas had bath rooms for individual use. Households using common bath rooms were about 2 percent in rural areas and 14 percent in urban areas.

2.7 *Sanitary condition.*—In rural areas facilities for flush, septic tank was almost negligible (less than 1% of households had this facility). Even bucket (2%) and pit (2%) were not very common. Most of the households (89%) used open ground. Households having other types of latrine were about 7 percent.

In urban areas, comparatively larger number of households had flush (12%) and septic tank (5%). The use of bucket (28%) and pit (9%) was more common in urban areas than rural areas and it may be stated that about 37 percent of households used bucket and pit. Table (7) shows the percentage distribution of households and number of persons by type of latrine. It is found that quite a large percentage of households (37%) used open ground even in urban areas. Percentage of households using other types of latrine was 9.

2.8 *Type of lighting.*—Both in rural and urban areas most of the people used kerosene for lighting purposes. Percentage of households using kerosene was 96 and 71 in rural and urban areas respectively. The use of electricity was comparatively much more in urban areas (28%) than rural areas (1%). The utilisation of other sources was almost negligible i.e., 3 per cent in rural and 1% in urban areas. Table (8) gives the percentage distribution of households and number of persons by type of lighting.

2.9 *Drinking water.*—In rural areas, well was the main source of drinking water. About 72 per cent of the households got drinking water from well. Next in importance were rivers, lakes and springs (10%) and tanks and ponds (8%). Percentage of households using tube-well water was only about 6%. The proportion of households for whom the source of drinking water was tap was very small (1.31%) in rural areas.

In urban areas the position was quite different. Tap was the main source of supply of drinking water (35%). Next in importance was well (32%). Percentage of tube well was 5, which almost agreed with the corresponding rural figure. A very small percentage of households in comparison to rural areas utilised tank and pond water (2%) and rivers, lakes and springs (2%) as the source of supply of drinking water. Table (9) gives the percentage distribution of households and persons by source of drinking water in rural and urban areas.

2.10 *Distance of source of drinking water.*—About 11 per cent of the households in rural areas and about 35 per cent of the households in urban areas had their source of supply of drinking water within the household premises.

About one third of the households both in rural and urban areas had to go up to 50 yards to fetch water. [refer Table (10)]

Further, half the number of households in rural areas and one third of the households in urban areas had to get their drinking water from a distance of more than 50 yards.

APPENDIX A

STATISTICAL TABLES

Explanatory Notes on Tables

A.1. Two sets of tables are included in this Appendix. One set represents tables for the entire rural areas and the other set for the entire urban areas (including four big cities i.e., Bombay, Calcutta, Delhi and Madras). For convenience, the table numbers have been coded. The letter A in the beginning of each table code stands for the Appendix A. The left hand most digit stands for the sector to which the tables belong, 1 for rural and 2 for urban. The digits following the first point from left stand for the item presented in the table. The items for which the tables are presented are given below :

1. persons per room
2. floor space
3. rooms occupied
4. type of dwelling
5. type of bath
6. type of latrine
7. type of lighting
8. source of drinking water
9. distance from the source of drinking water

A.2. The estimates in each table are given by sub-samples (indicated by s1 and s2) and by the combined sample (indicated by comb.)

A.3. The estimates are given at all-India level only.

A.4. In each table data are given by two-way classes of households. For example, estimated number of persons is given by per capita floor space in square feet and by monthly household size. The classificatory characters used for grouping are given below :

1. household size
2. monthly household expenditure
3. monthly per capita expenditure
4. per capita floor space
5. number of rooms occupied
6. source of drinking water
7. distance from the source of drinking water
8. type of dwelling
9. type of latrine
10. type of bath
11. type of lighting

A.5. For most of the items data are given in the form of percentage distributions of number of household and persons by specified two-way classes.

A.6. For presenting tables of percentage distributions, following bases are used :

- (a) base : total number of households or persons=100
- (b) base : total number of households or persons under each column=100
- (c) base : total number of households or persons under each row or line=100

A.7. Method of classification of households under different classes such as household size, monthly household expenditure and monthly per capita expenditure, number of rooms occupied, type of dwelling, latrine, bath room and lighting, source of drinking water and distance from the source of drinking water, floor space, per capita floor space, house rent and structure type are given below :

A.7.1 *Household size*.—Household size as reported against line 1 of block 2 was used as a classificatory character to form different groups of household size. Those members of the household (listed in block 9) who satisfied the condition of minimum of 16 days of stay during reference period were included in the household size. (vide para 2.2.1, item 1 of Instructions to Field Workers, Vol.I).

A.7.2 *Monthly household expenditure level*.—Households were classified by the average monthly household expenditure as reported in Block 2 against item 7 of schedule I.0 and not on actual monthly household expenditure.

A.7.3 *Monthly per capita expenditure level*.—Households were classified by the monthly per capita expenditure as obtained by dividing the actual monthly expenditure of the household by the household size as given against line 8 of Block 2.

A.7.4 *Number of rooms occupied*.—Grouping for the number of rooms occupied was done according to the details available against line 12, column 3 of block 18 of the schedule.

A.7.5 *Type of dwelling*.—Information about dwellings as reported against line 1, column 3 of block 18 was used for classification of household under chawl and bustee, flat, independent house and other types of dwellings.

A.7.6 *Type of latrine*.—Details of the type of latrine was obtained from line 19, column 3 of block 18. This information was classified under flush, septic, bucket, pit, open ground and other types of latrines.

A.7.7 *Type of bath*.—Details for bath room as obtained from line 20, column 3 of block 18 was used for classifying households and persons under baths with individual use, in common use and no bath.

A.7.8 *Type of lighting*.—Households and persons were classified for different types of lighting according to the information available against line 23, column 3 of block 18 under electricity, kerosene and other sources of lighting.

A.7.9 *Source of drinking water*.—Information about the source of drinking water was available against line 21, column 3 of block 18 under municipal tap, well, tube well, tank and pond, river, lake and spring and other sources.

A.7.10 Information about the distance from source of drinking water was available against line 22, column 3 of block 18.

Reference to floor space and per capita floor space is given below :

1. floor space (block 18, column 3, line 16)
2. per capita floor space was obtained by dividing the floor space by household size.

A.7.11 It may be mentioned that the group which varies with the classificatory characteristics are not given here in order not to unduly increase the bulk of the report. They can easily be seen from the actual tables given in Appendix A.

APPENDIX B

SAMPLING DESIGN AND METHOD OF ESTIMATION

Sampling Design and Method of Estimation

B.1 A broad outline of the sampling design and estimation procedure as followed in the rural and urban sectors are given below :

A. Sampling design for the rural sector

B.2 *General*.—A stratified two-stage sampling design was adopted in which the first stage units were the villages and the second stage units were the households from which information was collected.

B.3 *Stratification*.—In each state, strata were formed by grouping together contiguous tehsils, more or less homogeneous with respect to population density, altitude above sea level and cultivation of food crops, in such a way that the population of each stratum was approximately the same. The number of strata in a state was made one-twelfth of the total allocation of sample villages for the state. This was done so because the number of sample villages selected for survey was 12 per stratum. The total number of strata so formed was 210 in the rural sector.

B.4 *Allocation*.—A total of 2616 villages were sampled in the rural sector. These sample villages were allocated to the different states on a joint consideration of their population, geographical area, crop acreage and the number of persons engaged in household enterprises on the basis of the 1951 census. A special weight was given to the state of Jammu & Kashmir in the final allocation to ensure better estimates for that state. The allocations were finally rounded off to multiples of 12. It may be noted that for the purpose of stratification and allocation, the Union Territories of Manipur and Tripura were merged with the state of Assam and those of Delhi and Himachal Pradesh with the Punjab.

B.5 *Selection*.—Within a stratum, the tehsils were first listed arranging them in a serpentine order (without breaking the geographical contiguity). Six villages were selected systematically with a random start, constituting one sub-sample for the stratum. Another six villages were selected in a similar manner with another random start, constituting the other sub-sample of the stratum. In case a stratum had a large area, it was divided into smaller regions (known as 'investigation zones') so that the area to be covered by an investigator was limited. From each such stratum two investigation zones were selected with probability proportional to the number of villages in them and with replacement. Two sets of six sample villages, constituting the two sub-samples, were selected from these two investigation zones in the manner described above. In case a sample village was too large for investigation purposes, a hamlet or a group of hamlets within the sample village was selected with equal probability and the survey in that village was restricted to the hamlet or group of hamlets thus selected.

B.6 The six sample villages in a stratum allotted to an investigator, were numbered from 1 to 6 according to their order of selection and were visited in that order in each 3rd round. In the first sub-round, the listing of all the six villages was completed and one household was selected at random from each of the sample villages 1, 3 and 5. In the second and each subsequent sub-rounds, 3 households were selected systematically with a random start from amongst the households belonging to all the six sample villages taken together. The data on housing condition were then collected from the selected households through household schedule 1.0: Consumer Expenditure.

B.7 *Work Programmes*.—The survey period in the rural sector was divided into six sub-rounds of two months each. In each stratum, two investigators were posted and the same two investigators worked throughout the survey period each surveying an independent sub-sample of 6 villages. The same 6 villages were surveyed in each sub-round by each investigator except in the first sub-round in which 3 of them were surveyed. Thus in each sub-round two independent and interpenetrating net work of sub-samples of villages were surveyed by two different parties of investigators.

B.8 Table (B. 1.1) gives the distribution of sample villages allotted and surveyed by states in rural areas.

Table (B. 1.2) gives the distribution of sample households allotted and surveyed by states in rural areas.

B.9 *Estimation procedure*.—The estimates presented are, in general, percentage distributions of estimated number of households or persons by two way classification of the household for some important characteristics such as average number of persons per room, floor space per person, latrine, bath, dwelling type etc. These estimates have been arrived at by computing in each case the estimates of the totals of the characteristics occurring. The procedure of estimation of total of a characteristic in a sub-sample is explained below :

Let

N_i = total number of villages in the i th stratum

n_j = number of sample villages in the i th stratum

w_{ij} = number of hamlet groups formed in the j th sample village in the i th stratum. ($w_{ij} = 1$, if there are no hamlet groups)

N_{ij} = total number of households listed in the j th sample village (or in the hamlet group selected from it) in the i th stratum.

n_{ij} = number of sample households surveyed in the j th sample village in the i th stratum.

from the i th stratum: then the unbiased estimate (\hat{T}) of total value of the characteristic for a given region (state/all India) built up from G strata within it, from one sample, are

where \hat{T}_1 and \hat{T}_2 are total estimates of sub-samples 1 and 2 for the characteristics under study.

B. Sampling design for the urban sector

B.10 *General*.—A stratified two-stage sampling design was adopted in which the first stage units were the 1951 census enumeration blocks and the second stage units were the households from which information was collected.

B.11 *Stratification*.—Each city with a population of 300,000 and above and each capital town of the former part A and part B states (prior to states reorganization in 1956), excepting Shillong the capital of Assam, formed an independent stratum. In the city of Calcutta, 8 sub-strata were formed, each stratum consisting of several adjoining wards (1951 census) and in Jammu & Kashmir, the town of Jammu was considered as separate stratum. In the rest of the urban areas, towns within each of the Natural Division (1951 census) constituted a stratum. In all 94 strata were formed in the whole of the urban sector.

B.12 *Allocation*.—Out of 2228 blocks sampled throughout the Indian Union for the fifteenth round, 216 were from Jammu & Kashmir and 12 from Chandigarh in Punjab. The remaining 2000 blocks were allocated to the different strata mainly in proportion to their respective non-agricultural urban population (1951 census). Preferential weights were given to the cities and towns, which were treated as a separate strata, while allocating the sample blocks. This was achieved first by allocating four-fifth of these blocks to all the strata in proportion to their non-agricultural population and then one-fifth only to cities and towns treated as separate strata in a similar way. In all cases, the stratum allocations were ultimately rounded off to multiples of 4 in view of the requirement of 4 independent sub-samples.

B.13 *Selection*.—The towns and cities (excepting those treated as separate strata) within each Natural Division were first arranged according to their means of livelihood classes. Within each of the livelihood classes they were further arranged according to geographical nearness as far as possible. Next the blocks within each town or city were also arranged according to their geographical nearness. With this arrangement of towns and blocks, 4 circular systematic sample blocks were drawn with independent random starts with a view to obtain 4 interpenetrating and independent sub-samples. Finally, one household was selected at random from each sample block for collection of data on housing condition through household schedule 1.0 : Consumer Expenditure. If a selected block was found to be very large, it was divided into a number of artificial blocks, each consisting of about 100 to 200 households. One of these artificial blocks was then selected with equal probability and a household was selected at random from it for survey.

B.14 Table (B.2.1) gives distribution of sample blocks allotted and surveyed by states in urban areas.

Table (B.2.2) gives distribution of sample households allotted and surveyed by states in urban areas.

B.15 *Estimation procedure*.—The estimates presented for the urban sector for a sub-sample are similar to those of rural sector. The estimates of 'total' of a characteristic for the urban sector are, however, obtained as follows :

APPENDIX C

VALIDITY OF RESULTS

Validity of Results

C.1.1 No agency other than the NSS has carried out any country-wide survey for providing estimates relating to housing condition at all-India level. Hence, the reliability of the estimates presented in the report could not be ascertained through comparisons with external sources. However, internal consistency could be seen by comparing results of two independent samples (IPNS) from the same survey (within round) and results obtained from different surveys (between rounds) under the same agency at different periods.

C.1.2 *Sub-sample estimates* : An idea of the margin of uncertainty of the estimates could be obtained from the interpenetrating samples (IPNS) adopted in the sample design. It has already been pointed out in Appendix B on 'Sampling Design and Method of Estimation' that all the sample villages and blocks were divided into 2 sets of independent samples separately. Each of these two interpenetrating samples supplied equally valid and independent estimates of the characteristics of the household under study. The two interpenetrating sample estimates provided 50 per cent margin of uncertainty for the combined estimate.

C.1.3 Estimates presented in Appendix A are given by sub-samples so that the divergence between the sub-sample estimates could be checked. Tables (A.1.1) to (A.1.68) in case of rural areas and tables (A.2.1) to (A.2.68) in case of urban areas present estimates for sub-samples 1 and 2 and combined sample.

C.1.4 The tables reveal that there is consistency between sub-sample estimates for most of the items. However, for some of the items the two sub-sample estimates do not agree very much. This may be due to the small sample size. These estimates should be used with caution.

C.2.1 *Inter-round comparison* : It has already been pointed out that one test of establishing validity of results is to check the consistency between results of different rounds. Comparison of the results of tenth, eleventh and twelfth rounds could be made from the tables (C.1.1) to (C.1.6) for rural sector and tables (C.2.1) to (C.2.6) for urban sector. It may be pointed out that only those items are taken into consideration the results of which are available from other rounds. These tables show that there is consistency between the estimates. Following points can be noted down from these tables.

1. It is seen from tables (C.1.1) and (C.2.1) that estimates of the average number of persons per room are consistent over the different rounds. It may, however, be mentioned that in rural areas this average has slightly decreased from 2.4 in the twelfth round to 2.3 in the fifteenth round while in urban areas it has increased from 2.2 to 2.3.

2. Average floor space per person has increased from 77.8 (twelfth round) to 80.8 (fifteenth round) square feet in rural areas while in urban areas there was no change. Estimates for different rounds are consistent over the groups of average floor space per person except for the last group.

3. Percentage of households by per capita floor space in rural areas has decreased in first two groups i.e. 0-25 and 26-50 per capita floor space group from 14.08 to 11.61 and 30.02 to 25.42 respectively. On the other hand for the same groups, in the urban areas percentage has increased from 17.34 to 21.28 in first group and 29.59 to 33.90 in the second group.

4. Percentage of households has fallen in the first four household size groups in urban areas.

5. The percentage distribution of households by number of rooms occupied under different groups as obtained in fifteenth round comes closer to those in the tenth and eleventh rounds than to the twelfth round in rural areas. On the other hand, for urban areas fifteenth round estimates are consistent with twelfth round.

6. Particulars of bath rooms could only be compared with twelfth round as information about bath rooms were not available for the tenth and eleventh rounds. It is found that figures are more consistent for rural areas than for urban areas.

APPENDIX D

EXTRACTS FROM THE INSTRUCTIONS TO FIELD WORKERS

Extracts from Instructions to Field Workers

NSS Fifteenth Round

Housing Condition

D.1 Data on 'Housing Condition' were collected through Household Schedule 1.0 : Consumer Expenditure. Extracts from the Instructions to Field Workers are reproduced only for the relevant items which were used for tabulating the material on Housing Condition. Paragraph numbers referred are exactly those which were referred in the Instructions to Field Workers, NSS Fifteenth Round, Volume I, on 'Design, Concepts, Definitions and Procedures'.

SECTION 2 : Household Schedule 1.0 : Consumer Expenditure

2.1 Block 1.—In this block will be entered the identification particulars of the sample households.

2.1.1 Items 1-3, 5-6, 8-11.—These are to be copied from the sample list. The box space against item 10 should be left blank in rural areas.

2.1.2 Item 4.—The particular subround in which the sample household is visited will be entered here.

2.1.3 Item 7.—The order of selection of the sample household as obtained from the listing schedule (0.1 or 0.2) of the 14th round is to be entered here.

2.1.4 Item 12.—If there is any hamlet selection within the sample village the name of the hamlet selected is to be written here.

2.1.5 Item 13.—The house number as entered in column (0), block 6 of the listing schedule concerned is to be entered here.

2.2 Block 2.—Information on some classificatory characters of the sample household is to be entered in this block.

2.2.1 Item 1 : household size.—For the purpose of this schedule, a household member has been defined as one who stayed for a period of 16 days (not necessarily continuous) or more during the period of 30 days preceding the date of enquiry and participated in the common kitchen. Thus, the total number of persons having membership type codes 1 and 3, recorded in the tenth place in column (3) of block 9 of the schedule, will represent household size for this schedule. This procedure is, however, different from the one followed in household schedule 10—employment and unemployment. Sometimes a sample household may be found in which none of the members (as noted under column (2) of block 9) stayed for 16 days or more during 30 days preceding the date of survey, as in the case of a newly formed household. In such a case the entry for household size against item 1 of block 2, would be 0 (zero). Such a household should be treated as casualty. A remark to this effect should be entered in block 19 but no entries are required for the household.

2.2.7 Item 7 : household expenditure.—An estimate of average monthly expenditure of the household for the purpose of domestic consumption should be entered here in rupees correct to two places of decimal. This estimate should consist of the value of goods and services consumed by the household. No code numbers are to be used as in the previous rounds.

2.2.8 Item 8 : household per capita expenditure.—The actual monthly per capita expenditure as recorded against line 13 of block 17 should be entered here in rupees correct to two places of decimal. No code numbers are to be used as in the previous rounds.

2.29 Block 18 : housing condition : Collection of data on residential housing and many of its aspects was done from the Seventh through the Twelfth rounds of the NSS. In the Thirteenth and the Fourteenth rounds the subject was dropped, and in the Fifteenth round this block on housing condition is being re-introduced. In the 12th round there was an additional block on the building and repair activities of the household during one year preceding the date of the survey. This block for the purpose of canvassing in the present round has been incorporated in schedule 1.4 with some modifications.

2.29.1 A dwelling etc. for this block includes any structurally separated room or suite of rooms in permanent structures used or intended for habitation by family households and having a separate access to a street or to a common passage or stairway. Detached room or rooms for habitation, which are clearly intended to form a part of the dwelling, should also be counted a part of the dwelling. It may be mentioned here that the first eleven items excepting item number 6 relate to permanent structure of which dwelling forms the part whereas the remaining items are intended for collection of detailed information of the house only in relation to the sample household.

The description of individual items is given below : For the purpose of filling in this block reference is invited to serial nos. 15 to 32 of codes given in Appendix 2 of this book.

2.29.3 Item 1.—The type of the structure has been classified under four categories, namely, chawl and bustee, flat, independent house, barracks and the like. A flat or an independent house is provided with the normal household amenities like water tap, latrine, bath room etc., for exclusive use of the members of the family residing there, whereas a chawl or a bustee is not so provided.

2.29.4 Item 2.—In this item is to be entered the number of storeys of the house. In case a house is partly double storeyed and partly single, or partly double and partly three storeyed, or the like, appropriate code is to be used or the highest storey of the building.

2.29.5 Item 3 : condition of structure.—Against this item is to be recorded the physical condition of the house in the sense whether the house is good for habitation and needs no immediate repairs; fairly good but needs no major repairs; bad and old and needs immediate major repairs or structural changes and improvised one not suitable for permanent habitation at all. Major repairs will be considered such essential repairs of the house which is otherwise very risky for the occupants to live in or has become very unhealthy for human habitation.

2.29.6 Item 4 : sewerage or drainage system.—After taking into account the condition of existing sewers or drain. (constructed by human effort), the appropriate code has to be given.

2.29.7 *Item 5 : ventilation.*—Whether the house of the sample household is well ventilated, tolerably ventilated or ventilation unsatisfactory in the opinion of the respondent, is to be recorded against this item.

2.29.8 *Item 6 : passage to dwelling.*—Record has to be made against this item whether the passage to the dwelling is for independent use of the members of the sample household or it is used in common with members of other household or households.

2.29.9 *Item 7.*—The age of the entire dwelling in which the sample household is located is to be entered against this item in completed number of years. In computing the age any fractional year will be counted as one year. For example, if the age be 5 or 6 or 7 months it will be counted as one year; if it be 4 years 9 months, it will be counted as 5 years, and so on. Further in recording the age, the year of completion of the original structure is to be taken into consideration; age of any additions to the original structure is not wanted. But it may so happen that the original structure is insignificant to the additions made after some years of the completion of the original one. In such cases of substantial structural additions on the ground floor, the age of the additional structure is to be recorded against this item, but in the case of vertical additions the age of the structure on the ground floor has to be taken into consideration. A difficulty may arise in getting the age from a respondent household if it happens to be tenant one. In such cases all possible means are to be tapped to get the correct information. Even if all attempts fail, such age is to be recorded as may be arrived at in consultation with the respondent.

2.29.10 *Item 8.*—Against this item is to be recorded the number of households, including the sample household, living in the dwelling house. If the sample household is the only occupant household, 1 is to be recorded.

2.29.11 *Items 9, 10, 11.*—The items are self-explanatory and entries are to be made in codes. The basic materials with which the plinth, wall and roof, floor are made of should be the deciding factors in choosing the appropriate code. In the case of any floating unit, such as a boat house or an abandoned railway wagon or compartment, mention should be made of its nature without entries for plinth, wall or roof. If the sample household does not occupy any part of the ground floor of the building, then the plinth type against item 1 will be the same as that of the ground floor of the house in which the household is located. Similarly in the case of roof type (item 11), record is to be made of the permanent roof of the top most floor of the house in which the sample household is an occupant.

2.29.12 *Items 12, 13.*—Number and area (in sq. ft.) of rooms are to be recorded against these items. Here rooms would mean construction with walls and/or partitions on all sides and a permanent roof overhead, used or intended to be used, for living purpose, and should include bedrooms, dining rooms, living rooms, habitable attics, servants' rooms and other habitable spaces separated from one another by walls or partitions and of a size large enough to hold a bed for an adult. Rooms regardless of size, if used exclusively for any household enterprise, should not be counted as parts of the dwelling and the total floor area of such rooms is to be recorded against item 28 of this block.

2.29.13 *Items 14, 15, & 16.*—A verandah with a permanent roof overhead is called a roofed verandah, so are corridors, stores, kitchen, bath and w.c. The lumped up area of these items are to be recorded in sq. ft. The total floor area to be recorded against item 16 is the sum total of items 13, 14 & 15.

2.29.14 *Item 17 : kitchen.*—This is self-explanatory and codes explain the different classificatory characters of kitchen.

2.29.15 *Items 18 & 19.*—*latrine.*—These items are also self-explanatory.

2.29.16 *Item 20 : bath.*—Bath room here would imply any covered space, with or without any roof, used for the purpose of taking bath. The nature of its use (in common or individual) in terms of codes, is to be recorded against this item.

2.29.17 *Item 21 & 22 : drinking water.*—The classificatory codes are self-explanatory. If more than one source is used, the one most used and its distance should be recorded in code.

2.29.18 *Item 23 : lighting.*—Needs no explanations, but the one most commonly used by the household is to be recorded.

2.29.19 *Item 24 : tenure status.*—The tenure status, as legally understood, of the sample household is to be determined by the status of the most important member of the household from the point of view of the right of occupancy.

2.29.20 *Item 25 : ownership.*—Whether the building is owned by Govt. or other public bodies, or by industrial or commercial organisation or private landlords or others like co-operative societies, charitable or religious institutions etc., is to be recorded, in terms of code number, against this item. For the owner, the appropriate code is to be given against this item, irrespective of the tenure status of the household recorded against item 24.

2.29.21 *Item 26 & 27 : rent.*—Whether the house is rented or not, is to be recorded against item 26, and if, rented, the monthly rent, is to be recorded against item 27.

2.29.22 *Item 28.*—If any portion of the residential house (and not of its surroundings) is exclusively used for any household enterprise by the sample household, the area (in sq. ft.) of such portion of the house should be recorded against this item.
