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

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The report entitled "TABLES WITH NOTES ON CONSUMER EXPENDITURE (SOME SELECTED ITEMS)" was prepared by the Indian Statistical Institute. The views contained in the report are not necessarily those of the Government of India.¹

INTRODUCTION

1.1 The data on household consumer expenditure are being collected in India in each round of the National Sample Survey (NSS) beginning from the first round which started in October 1950. The set of tables presented in this report are based on the data collected in the household Schedule 1.0 (Consumer Expenditure) during the eighteenth round.

1.2 The field work of the eighteenth round started in February 1963 and continued upto January 1964 covering a period of one complete year. The reference period for collection of data on household consumer expenditure was 30 days preceding the date of survey. The estimates presented in the report, therefore, broadly relate to the period January 1963 to January 1964. So far as the sub-rounds are concerned, the period of field work and the approximate period to which the sub-round estimates relate are shown as follows :

1.3 The geographical coverage of the survey was the entire Indian Union excluding, however, the islands of Andaman, Nicobar, Amindive, Minicoy and Laccadive, the Ladakh district of Jammu and Kashmir, the North East Frontier Agency, Mao, Ukhru and Tamenlong sub-divisions of Manipur, the Lungleh sub-division of Mizo (Lusai) hills and the Union Territories of Pondicherry, Goa, Daman and Diu.

1.4 A stratified two-stage self-weighted sample design with villages and urban blocks as the first stage units in the rural and urban sectors respectively and households as the second stage units in both the sectors was adopted for the eighteenth round. Information was collected by interviewing one of the members (usually the head of a household) of the sample households. Altogether 21,721 sample households from 8,466 sample villages in the rural sector and 4,257 sample households from 4,571 sample blocks in the urban sector, were surveyed. An account of the sample design and the method of estimation as adopted for the eighteenth round survey has been given in Appendix I.

1.5 The scope of the present report is, however, limited. It gives estimates of value and quantity of consumption per person per 30 days and average price per standardised unit (as defined in para 2.5) for a few selected items like rice, wheat, jowar, bajra, maize, barley, small millets, ragi, gram, total cereals, salt, kerosene and cotton-dhoti & sari. In addition, estimates of consumer expenditure on food items and total consumer expenditure per person per 30 days are furnished.

1.6 The estimates are presented in the report by six sub-rounds into which the whole survey period of one year is divided, by four independent and interpenetrating sub-samples and by the combined sample. For all practical purposes, the combined sample estimate should be used. The sub-sample estimates are provided to give an idea of the margin of error of the survey results. When the sample size is large, the difference between the maximum and the minimum of the four sub-sample estimates provides for a confidence interval with a probability of 1-($\frac{1}{2}$)⁴-1 or 0.875 for including the true value within it. The sub-round estimates supply information on seasonal variations within the round. The sub-sample breakdowns of the sub-round estimates have not been presented in the report. A particular sub-round estimate, therefore, represents the combined sample estimate for that sub-round.

1.7 A facsimile of schedule of investigation is given in Appendix II.

CONCEPTS AND DEFINITIONS

2.1 The concepts and definitions adopted for the consumer expenditure enquiry during the eighteenth round continue to remain the same as in the corresponding enquiry in the earlier rounds. Some of the important concepts and definitions are given here.

2.2 *Household*.—A household is a group of persons usually living together and taking principal meals from a common kitchen. A boarding house, a hotel or a hostel is treated as a cluster of households, where each individual boarder (with his dependents or guests, if any) forms a separate household. Households maintained and fed directly by government, such as those in prisons, police quarters, cantonments, hospitals, asylums and relief camps, are, however, excluded from the scope of consumer expenditure enquiry of the National Sample Survey.

2.3 *Household size*.—Any person who takes principal meals with a household for at least 16 days (not necessarily continuous) out of 30 days preceding the date of survey is considered to be a member of that household. Such a person may be the head of the household, a relation or protege of the head or an employee or guest of the household. The number of members, as defined above, in a household gives the household size.

2.4 *Household consumer expenditure*.—Consumer expenditure of a household comprises all expenditure incurred by the household during a reference period of 30 days preceding the date of survey exclusively towards its non-productive purposes. Thus all expenses towards the enterprise activities of the household are excluded. While consumption by pet animals of the household is included in the household consumption, the consumption by the livestock of the household is excluded as it is a part of the enterprise expenses of the household. A uniform concept of consumption is not available for all items in the schedule. For items belonging to the category of food, intoxicants and fuel and light (*i.e.*, items of blocks 10-13 of the schedule), consumption implies actual amount consumed (irrespective of the amount purchased or produced for non-productive domestic consumption purposes) during the reference period. For clothing items (*i.e.*, items of block 14), consumption implies maiden use only. So far as the items of blocks 10-14 are concerned, consumption out of transfer receipts in kind like the receipt of loans, gifts, charities, free collections etc., is included in the household consumption, while transfer payments in kind like loans (advanced or repaid), gifts, charities etc. are excluded from the scope of household consumption. Consumption out of goods purchased in cash is evaluated at the actual purchase price irrespective of the period of purchase, that the goods produced by the household, at the ex-farm or ex-factory price and that of goods received by barter exchanges or by transfer receipts, at the average retail price prevailing in the locality of the sample household during the reference period. In case of items like miscellaneous goods and services and consumers' rent and taxes (*i.e.*, items of block 15) and durable goods (*i.e.*, items of block 16), there is no separate concept of purchase and consumption as in the case of the items of blocks 10-14. The actual expenditure incurred (in cash or in kind) on an item of consumption during the reference period towards its purchase, construction, maintenance, repair or use for non-productive purposes is considered to be the consumer expenditure on that item. Expenditure towards purchase of land and building or construction of building for residential purposes is excluded from the purview of the household consumer expenditure as it is considered as an expenditure on capital formation of the household. Expenditure towards repair and maintenance of residential house is, however, included in the household consumer expenditure. Second-hand purchases are excluded from the scope of current consumer expenditure.

2.5 *Average price*.—The ratio of estimated value of consumption to the estimated quantity of consumption has been termed here as 'average price'. It is, in fact, a weighted average of retail prices (as also of farm prices when consumption includes home produced cereals) with weights proportional to

- (i) corresponding quantities of consumption when the sampling design is self weighted,
- (ii) corresponding quantities of consumption and multipliers when the sampling design is not self weighted.

The average price as defined above can be conveniently used to get an idea of price level when the item concerned represents a group of commodities, *e.g.*, rice and rice products, wheat and wheat products, total cereals, etc., for which the corresponding prices are not available straightway.

EXPLANATORY NOTES ON TABLES

3.1 Altogether ten different types of tables have been included in the present report. These are as follows :

- (i) Value (in Rs. 0.00) and quantity (in 0.00 srs.) of consumption per person per 30 days of major cereals by sub-rounds, corresponding to Tables (1.1.0)—(1.1.19) & (2.1.0) —(2.1.19).
- (ii) Value (in Rs. 0.00) and quantity (in 0.00 srs.) of consumption per person per 30 days of major cereals by sub-samples, corresponding to Tables (1.2.0)—(1.2.19) & (2.2.0) —(2.2.19).
- (iii) Average price (in Rs. 0.00) per seer of major cereals by sub-rounds, corresponding to Tables (1.3.0) & (2.3.0).
- (iv) Average price (in Rs. 0.00) per seer of major cereals by sub-samples, corresponding to Tables (1.4.0) & (2.4.0).
- (v) Value (in Rs. 0.00) and quantity (in 0.00 srs.) of consumption per person per 30 days and average price (in Rs. 0.00) per seer of salt by sub-rounds, corresponding to Tables

- (vi) Value (in Rs. 0.00) and quantity (in 0.00 srs.) of consumption per person per 30 days and average price (in Rs. 0.00) per seer of salt by sub-samples, corresponding to Tables (1.6.0) & (2.6.0).
- (vii) Value (in Rs. 0.00) and quantity (in 0.00 srs.) of consumption per person per 30 days and average price (in Rs. 0.00) per seer of Kerosene by sub-rounds, corresponding to Tables (1.7.0) & (2.7.0).
- (viii) Value (in Rs. 0.00) and quantity (in 0.00 srs.) of consumption per person per 30 days and average price (in Rs. 0.00) per seer of Kerosene by sub-samples, corresponding to Tables (1.8.0) & (2.8.0).
- (ix) Value (in Rs. 0.00) and quantity (in 0.00 yds.) of consumption per person per 30 days and average price (in Rs. 0.00) per yard of cotton-dhoti & sari by sub-rounds, corresponding to Tables (1.9.0) & (2.9.0).
- (x) Value (in Rs. 0.00) and quantity (in 0.00 yds.) of consumption per person per 30 days and average price (in Rs. 0.00) per yard of cotton-dhoti & sari by sub-samples, corresponding to Tables (1.10.0) & (2.10.0).

3.2 Estimates in all tables, except in table-types (iii) & (iv), have been supplied for the rural and urban sectors of All India, each State and each Union Territory covered under the NSS. The estimates for table-types (iii) & (iv) have, however, been given for All India and for selected States and Union Territories only. The selection of a State (or Union Territory) for the purpose of presenting average price of a particular cereal item was done mainly by considering the proportion of consumption of the item to the total quantity of all cereal consumed in the State (or Union Territory). If this proportion was negligible (generally of the order of one percent or less) for a State (or Union Territory) then that State (or Union Territory) was not ordinarily selected unless the contribution by that State (or Union Territory) towards the total quantity of consumption of the item in question at All India level was appreciable.

3.3 The identification of the items tabulated for the present report are given below in terms of blocks, lines and columns of Schedule 1.0 of the eighteenth round.

Each of the cereal items (1—9) referred to above represents whole grains and products of whole grains like chira, moori, khoi, lawa, atta, maida, suji, sattu etc., which are obtained by splitting, powdering, heating, frying, parching, and so on. However, food items like cooked rice, bread, chapati, cakes, biscuits, sweets etc., which are prepared mainly from these cereal items are not considered as cereal products in the sense referred to above and are not included in items 1—9. These food items are, however, included in item 14-total food and item 15-total consumer expenditure.

3.4 The symbol “.” in the tables represents absence of reporting sample households, while the symbol “0.00” stands for negligible small estimates which cannot be expressed even in two decimal places.

SUMMARY OF RESULTS

4.1 The present section gives a summary of the survey results presented in the report for the period, February 1963 to January 1964. The figures quoted in the text and the estimates presented in the summary tables (Tables 4.1-4.4) all relate to the combined samples estimates, except in Tables 4.5 and 4.6.

4.2 Table 4.1 below summarises information relating to consumer expenditure on food, total consumer expenditure and percentage of total consumer expenditure devoted to food for different States and Union Territories and for All-India.

4.3 The survey results for the period February 1963-January 1964 show that the total consumer expenditure per person per 30 days for the rural sector of the country as a whole is Rs. 22.41 and that for the urban sector, Rs. 32.81. The expenditure on food per person per 30 days is Rs. 15.72 for the rural sector while it is Rs. 22.41 for the urban sector. It is also observed in the case of States and Union Territories, that the per capita consumer expenditure on food and per capita total consumer expenditure for the urban sector are higher than those for the rural sector. The extent of variation between rural and urban per capita consumer expenditure is from Rs. 0.39 (Jammu & Kashmir) to Rs. 8.63 (Delhi) in respect of food items and from Rs. 3.37 (Jammu & Kashmir) to Rs. 26.52 (Delhi) in respect of all items. There is also a wide difference in the rate of consumer expenditure per person per 30 days amongst the States and Union Territories. The total consumer expenditure per person per 30 days ranges from Rs. 19.45 (Orissa) to Rs. 27.91 (Punjab) for the rural sector and from Rs. 26.33 (Mysore) to Rs. 46.79 (Delhi) for the urban sector. The range of per capita expenditure on food is from Rs. 13.75 (Kerala) to Rs. 19.63 (Jammu & Kashmir) for the rural sector and from Rs. 16.48 (Mysore) to Rs. 26.97 (Assam) for the urban sector.

4.4 The percentage of total consumer expenditure spent on food is an important indicator of level of living of the population of a place. The smaller the percentage, the higher the level of living. The said percentage is 70.15% for the rural sector of India and 59.65% for the urban sector, indicating that the level of living in the towns and cities is better than that of the countryside. The percentage is also observed to be higher for the rural sector of a State or Union Territory. Wide difference in the percentage for the rural and urban sectors is indicative of wide variation in the rural and urban levels of living. The range of variation of the said percentage is considerable amongst the States and Union Territories. It ranges from 66.06% (Maharashtra) to 76.12% (Bihar) for the rural sector and from 50.52% (Delhi) to 67.60% (Bihar) for the urban sector.

4.5 Information relating to value and quantity of consumption of cereals has been summarised in table (4.2) by States and Union Territories and in table (4.3) by items for rural and urban areas in India.

4.6. There is wide variation in the rate of consumption of cereals in the rural and urban sectors in the country. The quantity of total cereals consumed per person per 30 days during February 1963—January 1964 is 18.83 seers for the rural areas in India, while it is 13.42 seers only for the urban sector. The rural rate of consumption is, therefore, about 40% higher than the urban rate at the country level. The State to State variation in the rate of consumption is also high. For example, the quantity of consumption per person per 30 days is the lowest for Kerala both for the rural and urban sectors (i.e. 11.11 seers for the rural sector and 10.92 seers for the urban sector) and the highest for Rajasthan (24.04 seers) in respect of the rural sector and Manipur (18.99 seers) in respect of the urban sector.

4.7. The value of consumption of total cereals per person per 30 days comes to Rs. 8.95 for the rural sector and Rs. 7.34 for the urban sector at the all-India level. As percentage to total consumer expenditure, it is about 40% for the rural sector and about 22% for the urban sector. A major part of consumer expenditure on total cereals is, however, spent on rice and wheat. For example in the rural sector, about 23% of total consumer expenditure is spent on rice, about 6% on wheat and about 11% on rest of the cereal items. The corresponding percentages for the urban sector are about 12% on rice, about 7% on wheat and approximately 4% on rest of cereals.

4.8. The quantity of total cereals consumed per person per 30 days is 18.83 seers for the rural sector and 13.42 seers for the urban sector and the quantity of rice and wheat consumed per person per 30 days is 11.85 seers for the rural sector and 10.92 seers for the urban sector. Thus rice and wheat constitute about 63% of total quantity of cereals consumed in the rural sector and about 81% in the urban sector. The quantity of other cereals (jowar, bajra, maize, barley, ragi, gram and small millets) consumed per person per 30 days is 6.98 seers for the rural sector and 2.50 seers for the urban sector, thus accounting for the balance of about 37% of total quantity of cereals consumed in the rural sector and about 19% in the urban sector.

4.9. Information relating to the average price of all cereals has been summarised by States and Union Territories in Table (4.2). It is observed that the average price of all cereals is generally higher in the urban areas than the corresponding price in the rural areas of a State or Union Territory, except in the States of Jammu & Kashmir and West Bengal, where the level of average price is more or less the same for both the rural and urban areas. Table (4.4) gives a summary of information on the average price of each individual cereal item and of three essential items of consumption—salt, kerosene and cotton—dhobi and sari. This table gives the average price of these items at the All India level separately for the rural and urban sectors and the minimum and the maximum average prices at the State or Union Territory level together with the names of States or Union Territories reporting such minimum and maximum average prices for each sector. The table is self-explanatory.

4.10. The quantity of salt consumed per person per 30 days in India comes to 0.51 seer for the rural sector and 0.44 seer for the urban sector. The per capita consumption is the highest for the State of Madras—0.85 seer for the rural sector and 0.69 seer for the urban sector and the lowest for Punjab—0.29 seer for the rural sector and 0.25 seer for the urban sector. The average price of salt is Re. 0.12 per seer for both the rural and urban sectors in India. There is, however, appreciable variation in the average price reported by the States and Union Territories. The range of variation is from Re. 0.08 (Madras) to Re. 0.26 (Himachal Pradesh/Manipur) for the rural sector and from Re. 0.08 (Kerala/Madras) to Re. 0.24 (Jammu & Kashmir/Tripura).

4.11. Kerosene is an indispensable item of domestic consumption for fuel and light purpose in India. The average quantity consumed per person per 30 days in India is 0.42 seer for the rural sector and 0.74 seer¹ for the urban sector. The range of variation in the quantity consumed per person per 30 days is from 0.22 seer (Jammu & Kashmir) to 0.57 seer (Assam/Gujarat/Maharashtra) for the rural sector and from 0.23 seer (Jammu & Kashmir) to 1.51 seer (Maharashtra) for the urban sector. The rate of consumption per person per 30 days is also high (1.30 seer) for the urban sector of Gujarat State. The average price per seer of Kerosene in India is Re. 0.59 for the rural sector and Re. 0.53 for the urban sector. The State wise average prices range from Re. 0.51 (Delhi) to Re. 0.88 (Jammu & Kashmir) for the rural sector and from Re. 0.45 (Delhi) to Re. 0.82 (Jammu & Kashmir) for the urban sector.

4.12. Consumption of cotton-dhoti and sari is reported by almost all States and Union Territories except Jammu & Kashmir and the rural areas of the Union Territory of Himachal Pradesh, where it is negligible. Appreciable variations are noticed in the per capita consumption between States and Union Territories and between the rural and urban sectors within a State or Union Territory. The average quantity consumed per person per 30 days in India is 0.60 yd. for the rural sector and 0.35 yd. for the urban sector. The average price per yard for All-India comes to Rs. 1.36 for the urban sector and Rs. 1.86 for the rural sector. The average price per yard ranges from Re. 1.00 (Himachal Pradesh) to Rs. 1.86 (Manipur) for the rural sector and from Rs. 1.21 (Punjab) to Rs. 2.71 (Assam) for the urban sector.

4.13. It may be worthwhile to conclude discussion on the survey results with some general comments on the sub-round estimates included in the report. The variation between sub-round estimates may arise from a number of independent sources. Firstly, the sub-round estimates are subject to random fluctuations due to sampling and non-sampling errors of survey. Such errors are not likely to differ much from sub-round to sub-round, since the sample size for each sub-round is more or less the same. The sub-round estimates are also subject to seasonal variations which are periodic in nature. True seasonal variations, however, are not likely to be brought out by the sub-round estimates because the periods to which these estimates approximately relate, as already referred to in para 1.2, are overlapping. Besides, the field work of one sub-round, owing to various operational difficulties, could not always be completed within the same sub-round and had to be staggered to the next sub-round. This might also increase the overlapping effect still further. The sub-round estimates might also be affected by a secular price trend operating throughout the survey period of the round. All these different sources of variability are confounded or mixed up inseparably with the sub-round estimates.

4.14. A summary table (Table 4.5) showing sub-round estimates of per capita quantity of consumption of a few important items has been presented for the rural and urban areas of India. A breakdown by the minimum and maximum sub-sample estimates has also been provided for each sub-round to show the extent of sampling and non-sampling errors of the survey. A similar table for average price (Table 4.6) has also been presented. These tables give a general impression that possibly the main source of variability of the sub-round estimates is attributable to seasonality. This is, by and large, true for the sub-round estimates of quantity of consumption as well as of average price. An exception is, however, noticed in the case of average price of wheat for which a secular trend seems to dominate the sub-round estimates.

APPENDIX I
SAMPLE DESIGN AND METHOD OF ESTIMATION

A. Sample design for the rural sector

1. General.—The sample design in the rural sector was stratified two-stage in which the first-stage units were the villages and the second-stage units were the households from which information was collected. The sample design was self-weighting for each sub-sample at State level.

2. Stratification.—In each state, agricultural regions were formed by grouping contiguous districts having similar crop pattern and population density. These regions, 48 in number, were broadly the same as were adopted in the sixteenth and the seventeenth rounds. Strata were formed within each State or Union Territory by grouping together, as far as possible, contiguous tehsils or parts of contiguous tehsils within the same agricultural region and NSS State block such that the sum of the sizes* of the villages were exactly equal for all strata within a state. While forming the strata, availability of good transport facilities between the tehsils of a stratum was also taken into account with a view to minimising the movement of an investigator within a stratum. In a few cases, however, strata cut across regions and/or NSS State blocks and were not geographically compact. Each compact section of such stratum within a region and NSS State block was called a sub-stratum. The number of strata formed was 353 in the whole of India. If a stratum was too large in area or if good transport facilities were not available between some segments of it, the stratum was divided into a convenient number of investigation zones so that the area of each zone was of manageable size and good transport facilities were available within each zone. Two investigation zones were selected with probability proportional to their total size. From each of the two selected investigation zones two sub-samples of 6 villages each were selected systematically with probability proportional to size.

3. Allocation.—The total sample size of 8472 villages was allocated to the different States on a joint consideration of their rural populations, areas under food crops and the available investigator strengths. This allocation was further modified to ensure a minimum sample size of 360 villages in each State and 192 villages in each of the Union Territories which participated in this round of NSS. The allocations were finally rounded off to multiples of 24 in view of 4 sub-samples of 6 villages each per stratum.

4. Selection of villages.—Within each stratum (ignoring sub-strata), the tehsils were arranged in a serpentine order and 4 independent and interpenetrating sub-samples of 6 villages each were selected circularly systematically with probability proportional to size. In case a sample village was too large for investigation purposes the village was demarcated into two or more parts of nearly equal population by grouping hamlets of that village and one of these parts or hamlets group was selected with equal probability. The survey for that village was restricted to the hamlet or group of hamlets thus selected.

5. Selection of households.—The households in the sampled village or hamlet groups were first arranged in 6 classes on the basis of their major source of income and household size. Then a 'combined sample' of households for several schedules including sch. 1-0 was selected linear systematically using the sampling interval and random start provided in the sample list which were fixed so as to make the design self-weighting. From this combined sample a sub-sample for sch. 1-0 was selected by the same method with 10 as the sampling interval.

6. Work programme.—The survey period for the whole round was one complete year divided into 6 sub-rounds of 2 months each. In each sub-sample of a stratum the 6 sample villages were numbered from 1 to 6 according to their order of selection. Each sample village was visited and surveyed only once in the whole round. Thus sample villager 1, 4, 3, 6, 5 and 2 were surveyed in sub-rounds 1 to 6 respectively.

7. Estimation procedure.—The estimates presented are, in general, estimates of ratios like per person value or quantity of consumption or average price for standard unit (as defined in para 2-5). These estimates have been arrived at by computing in each case, the estimates of the totals of the two characteristics involved. The procedure of estimation of the total of a characteristic is explained below:

Let,

j denote — j^{th} sample household

i .. — i^{th} sample village

s .. — s^{th} stratum

k .. — number of strata in a state

n .. — number of sample villages selected in a stratum for a sub-sample

h .. — number of households selected

y .. — value of the characteristic

M .. — constant multiplier.

Then the estimate \hat{Y} of the 'State total' of this characteristic built up from one sub-sample, is given by

$$\hat{Y} = M \sum_{s=1}^k \sum_{i=1}^{n_s} \sum_{j=1}^{h_{sj}} y_{sij} \dots \quad (i)$$

Let \hat{Y}_1 , \hat{Y}_2 , \hat{Y}_3 , and \hat{Y}_4 be the estimates as in (i) above on the basis of sub-samples 1, 2, 3 and 4 respectively. Then the combined estimate of 'State total' based on all the four sub-samples is obtained as

$$\hat{Y}_0 = \frac{1}{4} (\hat{Y}_1 + \hat{Y}_2 + \hat{Y}_3 + \hat{Y}_4) \dots \quad (ii)$$

*The size of village was taken as its 1951/1961 census population depending on the frame used in that state rounded off to next multiple of 1000. The 1951 census list of villages was used as the sampling frame in all states except Jammu & Kashmir. In Jammu & Kashmir and the union territories, the 1961 census list of villages was used as the sampling frame.

The i^{th} sub-sample estimate of a ratio $R = \frac{Y}{X}$ is obtained as

$$\hat{R}_i = \frac{\hat{Y}_i}{\hat{X}_i} \quad \dots \quad (\text{iii})$$

The combined estimate of R is given by

$$\hat{R} = \frac{\hat{Y}_0}{\hat{X}_0} = \frac{(\hat{Y}_1 + \dots + \hat{Y}_4)}{(\hat{X}_1 + \dots + \hat{X}_4)} \quad \dots \quad (\text{iv})$$

For a sub-round wise estimate the same formulae as stated above were used, the summation being taken over the sample units allocated to that sub-round only.

B. Sample design for the urban sector

8. *General.*—A two stage sample design was adopted in which the urban blocks formed the first stage units and the households the second stage units. The sample design was self-weighting for each sub-sample at the sector level in a State.

9. *Stratification.*—In each State and Union Territory the urban area was divided into two sectors, sector 1 consisting of the State or Union Territory capital and all towns and cities with 1951 census population 50,000 and above, and sector 2 consisting of the remaining urban areas. These two sectors formed the two strata within each State except in Maharashtra. In Maharashtra, 3 strata were formed; Bombay city constituted one stratum, the rest of sector 1 formed another stratum and sector 2 the third stratum. Thus 37 strata were formed in all.

10. *Allocation.*—The total sample size of 4572 blocks was allocated to the states in proportion to their urban population with twice the weightage to sector 1. In finalising the allocation to the states, the available investigator strength and the rural workload were also taken into account. The allocations were then modified to ensure a minimum of 144 sample blocks in each state and 48 sample blocks in each union territory participating in NSS. The allocations to sectors within a state was in proportion to the number of blocks in them with twice the weightage to sector 1.

11. *Selection of blocks.*—From each urban stratum 4 independent interpenetrating sub-samples of blocks were selected. In sector 1 the sample blocks were selected circularly systematically from the list of blocks prepared by the NSS in the Urban Frame Survey (UFS), (except in Chandigarh where the 1961 census frame was used) with probability proportional to size which was block population rounded off to the next multiple of 1000. In sector 2 the sample blocks were selected circularly systematically with equal probability after arranging the towns according to their means of livelihood pattern as per the 1951 census data.

For selection, UFS frame was generally used and if that was not available 1961 census frame was used. In the remaining towns for which neither the UFS nor the 1961 census frame was available, the number of blocks in a town was taken as the number of 1951 census blocks in it with adjustment for the increase. In any such town the actual selection of the sample blocks was done in the field from the UFS frame or 1961 census frame or from sub-divisions of the municipal divisions in the town, using the interval specified in the sample list.

In case a sample block was too large for investigation purposes sub-blocks of approximately equal population were formed within the sample block and one of them was selected with equal probability. The survey for that block was confined to the group of sub-blocks selected.

12. *Selection of households.*—The households in the sample block or selected sub-block were first arranged in 5 classes on the basis of their major source of income and household size. Then a 'combined sample' of households for several schedules including schedule 1·0 was selected linearly systematically using the sampling interval and random start provided in the sample list which were fixed so as to make the design self-weighting. From this combined sample a sub-sample for sch. 1·0 was selected by the same method with 30 as the sampling interval.

13. *Work Programme.*—As in the rural sector the survey period of one year was divided into 6 sub-rounds of 2 months each. In each sub-sample of a stratum the urban blocks were numbered from 1 according to their order of selection. Each block was visited and surveyed only once in the whole round according to a given programme. For example, block numbers 1, 7, 13, were to be surveyed in sub-round 1, block numbers 2, 8, 14, were to be surveyed in sub-round 2, and so on.

14. *Estimation procedure.*—The estimates presented for the urban sector are similar to those of the rural sector. The estimate of the total of a characteristic for the urban sector, is however, obtained as follows :

Let,

j denote the j^{th} sample household

i , , , i^{th} sample block

s , , , s^{th} sector

k , , , number of sectors in the state

h , , , number of households selected

n , , , number of sample blocks selected in a sector for a sub-sample

y , , , value of the characteristic

M , , , constant multiplier.

Then, the estimate \hat{Y} of the 'State total' of a characteristic built up from one sub-sample is given by

$$\hat{Y} = \sum_{s=1}^k M_s \sum_{i=1}^{n_s} \sum_{j=1}^{h_{si}} y_{sij}$$

The combined estimates for aggregates and ratios are obtained in the same manner as described for the rural sector.

As in the rural sector a sub-round wise estimate for the urban sector was built up by using the same formulae as stated above, the summation being taken over the sample units allocated to that sub-round only.
