MISCELLANEOUS

HIGHLIGHTS

- The total plan expenditure increased substantially from Rs. 1960 Crore during First Plan (1951-56) to Rs. 1525639 (RE) Crore during Tenth Plan (2002-07).
- The total 11th Plan (2007-12) outlay is Rs. 3644717 Crore. Between 1961 and 1980 about 80% of the outlay had been allotted to the sectors of Agriculture & allied, Irrigation and Flood control, Power, industry & Minerals and Transport & Communications. From Sixth Plan onwards, the priority sectors have been Energy, Transport and Social Services.
- The disabled population was recorded about 22 million in Census 2001, of which 48% were visual disabled followed by 28% of loco-motor disabled and 10% were mental disabled persons.
- The per capita intake of calorie reduced both in rural and urban from 2266K calorie during 1972-73 to 2047K Cal during 2004-05 and

- from 2107 K Cal during 1972-73 to 2020 K Cal during 2004-05 respectively. The protein intake in rural areas reduced from 62 gm during 1972-73 to 57 gm during 2004-05 while in urban areas it marginally increased from 56 gm to 57 gm during the corresponding years.
- The percentage of urban population had increased over the period i.e. from 11% in 1901 to 28% in 2001.
- During 1901-2001, among the four metropolitan cities, population growth was highest in Delhi followed by Mumbai.
- The growth rate increased from 3.5% per annum during the first five year plan to 7.7% per annum during the Tenth Five Year Plan. The growth rate during the Eleventh Five Year plan so far has been 7.8% per annum.
