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1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Changes in PLFS from 2025

1.1.1 Since its launch in 2017, information collected in the Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) conducted by the National Statistics Office (NSO), MoSPI has been the primary source of statistics on labour force, activity participation of the population and structure of employment and unemployment in the country. These statistical indicators on labour market are required for planning, policy and decision making at various levels, both within and outside government and are also extensively used by various researchers.

1.1.2 PLFS was launched in 2017 essentially to address the following two objectives

- to estimate the key employment and unemployment indicators (*viz.* Worker Population Ratio, Labour Force Participation Rate, Unemployment Rate) in the short time interval of three months for the urban areas only in the Current Weekly Status (CWS)
- to estimate employment and unemployment indicators in both usual status (ps+ss) and CWS in both rural and urban areas annually

Usual Status (ps+ss) and Current Weekly Status (CWS) refers to frameworks for determining activity status of persons surveyed based on reference periods of last 365 days and last 7 days preceding the date of survey, respectively.

1.1.3 The quarterly results of PLFS are brought out in the form of Quarterly Bulletins. Till 2024, twenty-five Quarterly Bulletins of PLFS corresponding to the quarter ending December 2018 to quarter ending December 2024 have been released.

1.1.4 Considering the need for generation of high-frequency labour force indicators with enhanced coverage, the sampling methodology of Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) has been revamped from January 2025. The revamped PLFS design is envisaged to address the following objectives

- to estimate the key employment and unemployment indicators (*viz.* Labour Force Participation Rate, Worker Population Ratio and Unemployment Rate) on a monthly basis for rural and urban areas in the Current Weekly Status (CWS¹) at all India level
- to extend the coverage of the Quarterly results of PLFS to rural areas and thereby producing quarterly estimates covering both rural and urban areas of India in the Current Weekly Status (CWS)
- to estimate important employment and unemployment indicators in both Usual Status² (ps+ss) and CWS for rural and urban areas annually

¹ The activity status of a person is determined on the basis of the activities pursued by the person during the specified reference period. The activity status determined on the basis of a reference period of last 7 days preceding the date of survey is known as the Current Weekly Status (CWS) of the person.

² The activity status determined on the basis of the reference period of last 365 days preceding the date of survey is known as the usual activity status of a person. Activity status in the Usual Status (ps+ss) is obtained by considering the Usual Principal Status (ps) and the Subsidiary Status (ss) together.

1.2 Indicators presented in Quarterly Bulletin of PLFS

1.2.1 In this quarterly bulletin estimates of key labour force indicators, viz., Labour Force Participation Rate (LFPR), Worker Population Ratio (WPR), Unemployment Rate (UR), distribution of workers by broad status in employment and industry of work in the Current Weekly Status (CWS) are presented separately for rural areas, urban areas and rural and urban areas combined.

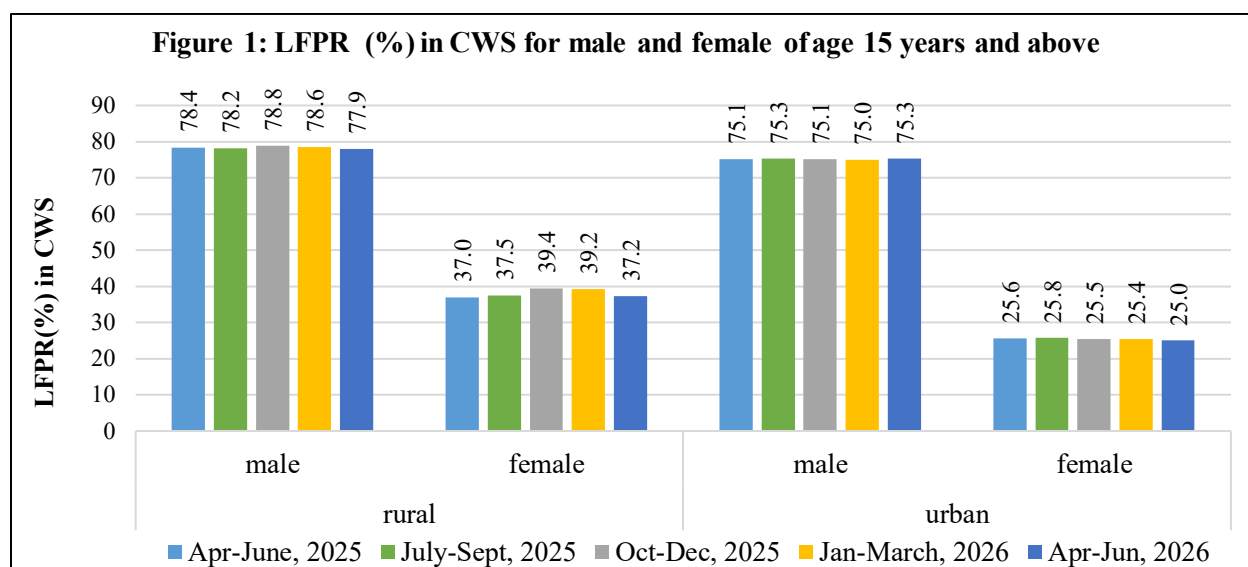
The PLFS Quarterly Bulletins released prior to January 2025 presented labour market indicators for the urban areas only. The present Quarterly Bulletin for the quarter April - June, 2026 is fifth in the series of PLFS Quarterly Bulletins covering both rural and urban areas.

2. Key Results

2.1 Labour Force Participation Rate (LFPR) in Current Weekly Status

2.1.1 Labour force refers to the part of the population which supplies or offers to supply labour for pursuing economic activities for the production of goods and services and therefore, includes both 'employed' and 'unemployed' persons. Labour Force Participation Rate (LFPR) is defined as the percentage of population in the labour force. Labour force according to Current Weekly Status (CWS) is the number of persons either employed or unemployed on an average in a week of 7 days preceding the date of survey.

2.1.2 LFPR (in percent) in Current Weekly Status for persons of age 15 years and above in the country during the quarter April - June, 2026 was 54.6%. LFPR (%) in rural areas was 56.9% as compared to LFPR of 50.2% recorded in urban areas for persons of age 15 years and above for the same quarter.



2.1.3 LFPR (%) among rural male of age 15 years and above was 77.9% during the quarter April - June, 2026. For rural female of the same age group LFPR (%) during the quarter April- June, 2026

was found to be 37.2%. In urban areas, LFPR (%) among female of age 15 years and above during April - June, 2026 was 25.0% compared to 75.3% observed for male of the same age group.

2.1.4. LFPR (%) among persons of age 15-29 years was 40.7% during the quarter April - June, 2026.

2.1.5 In Statement 1, estimates of LFPR in CWS during the quarters April - June, 2025, July-September, 2025, October-December, 2025, January – March, 2026 and April - June, 2026 are presented for different age groups.

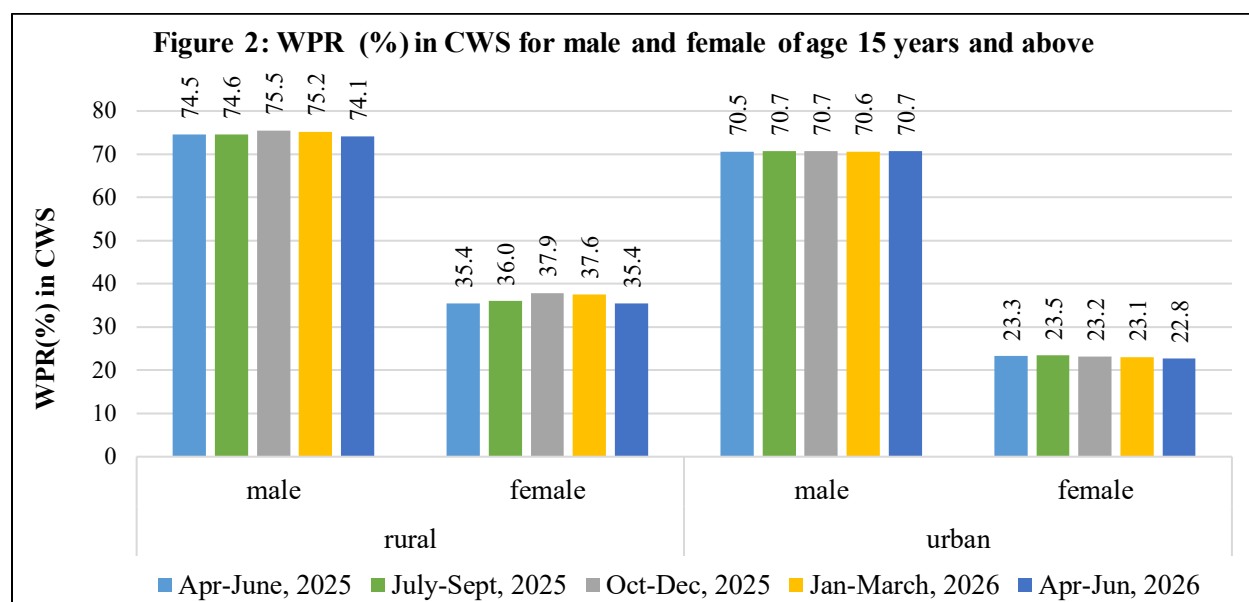

2.2 Worker Population Ratio (WPR) in Current Weekly Status

2.2.1 Worker Population Ratio (WPR) is defined as the percentage of workers in the population. The workforce measured in CWS gives the average picture of the workforce in a short period of one week during the survey period. The estimate of workforce in the CWS provides the number of persons who worked for at least 1 hour on any day during the 7 days preceding the date of survey.

2.2.2 WPR (in percent) in Current Weekly Status for persons of age 15 years and above in the country during the quarter April - June, 2026 was 51.7%. WPR (%) in rural areas was 54.2% as compared to WPR of 46.8% recorded in urban areas for persons of age 15 years and above for the same quarter.



2.2.3 WPR (%) among rural male of age 15 years and above was 74.1% during the quarter April - June, 2026. For rural female of the same age group WPR (%) during the quarter April - June, 2026 was found to be 35.4%. In urban areas, WPR (%) among female of age 15 years and above during quarter April - June, 2026 was 22.8% compared to 70.7% observed for male of the same age group.

2.2.4. WPR (%) among persons of age 15-29 years was 34.3% during the quarter April - June, 2026.

2.2.5 In Statement 2, estimates of WPR in CWS during the quarters April-June, 2025, July–September, 2025, October – December, 2025, January – March, 2026 and April - June, 2026 are presented for different age groups.

2.3 Number of Workers in Current Weekly Status in absolute terms

2.3.1 The Worker Population Ratio (WPR) estimates for persons of age 15 years and above obtained from PLFS have been applied to the corresponding projected population figures derived from the projections³ made available by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) to arrive at the number of workers. The mechanism used for generating the worker estimates in absolute terms has been explained in Appendix C.

2.3.2 During the quarter April - June, 2026, out of 10,85,858 thousand persons of age 15 years and above, on an average 5,65,665 thousand persons were employed. Out of this total employed of age 15 years and above, 4,01,642 thousand were male and 1,64,023 thousand were female. Among the male employed of age 15 years and above, 2,52,244 thousand were from rural areas and 1,49,398 thousand from urban areas. The corresponding figures in respect of female workers of age 15 years and above from rural and urban areas were respectively 1,18,673 thousand and 45,350 thousand.

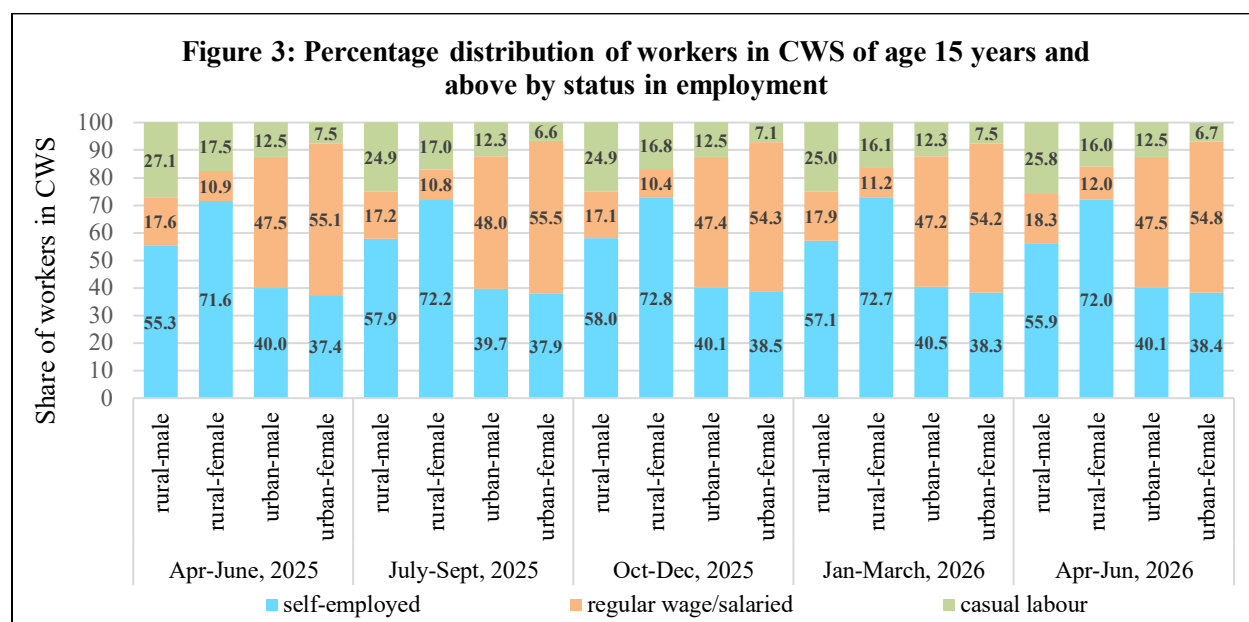
2.3.3 **Note regarding estimation of number of workers**

It may be noted that the accuracy of the worker estimates in absolute terms is dependent on quality of the projected population figures. Regarding the projected population figures it is to be noted that population projection is a scientific attempt to peep into the future population scenario, under certain assumptions, by using available data at that point of time. The assumptions made with probability of their coming out to be true, forms a critical input in this mathematical effort. Predicting the future course of human fertility and mortality is not an easy task, especially when looking ahead of time, is bound to be influenced by medical and health intervention strategies, food production and its equitable distribution, climatic condition, socio-cultural setting, politico economic conditions and a host of other factors affecting the population dynamics. This makes it a really difficult exercise. Therefore, caution must be exercised while interpreting these worker estimates using the population projections in the context of various conditions imposed.

2.4 Distribution of workers in Current Weekly Status by broad status in employment

2.4.1 The workers in CWS are classified into three broad categories according to their status in employment. These broad categories are: (i) self-employed, (ii) regular wage/salaried employee and (iii) casual labour.



2.4.2 The percentage distribution of workers in CWS of age 15 years and above shows that in rural areas, most of the workers were self-employed during April- June, 2026. 55.9% of male and 72.0% of female workers in rural areas were self-employed. In urban areas, the majority of the workers in CWS worked as regular wage /salaried, with 47.5% of male workers and 54.8% of female workers of age 15 years and above working as regular wage /salaried.

2.4.3 In Statement 3, the distribution of the workers of age 15 years and above in CWS by status in employment is presented. Within the category of self-employed, two sub-categories have been made as follows: (a) own account worker and employer combined together and (b) contributing family worker. It may be noted that self-employed persons who did not work either due to sickness or due to other reasons, though they had self-employment work, are included in column 5 of this Statement. Thus, the estimates given in column 5 may be higher than the sum of the estimates presented in column 3 and column 4.

2.5 Distribution of workers in Current Weekly Status by broad industry of employment

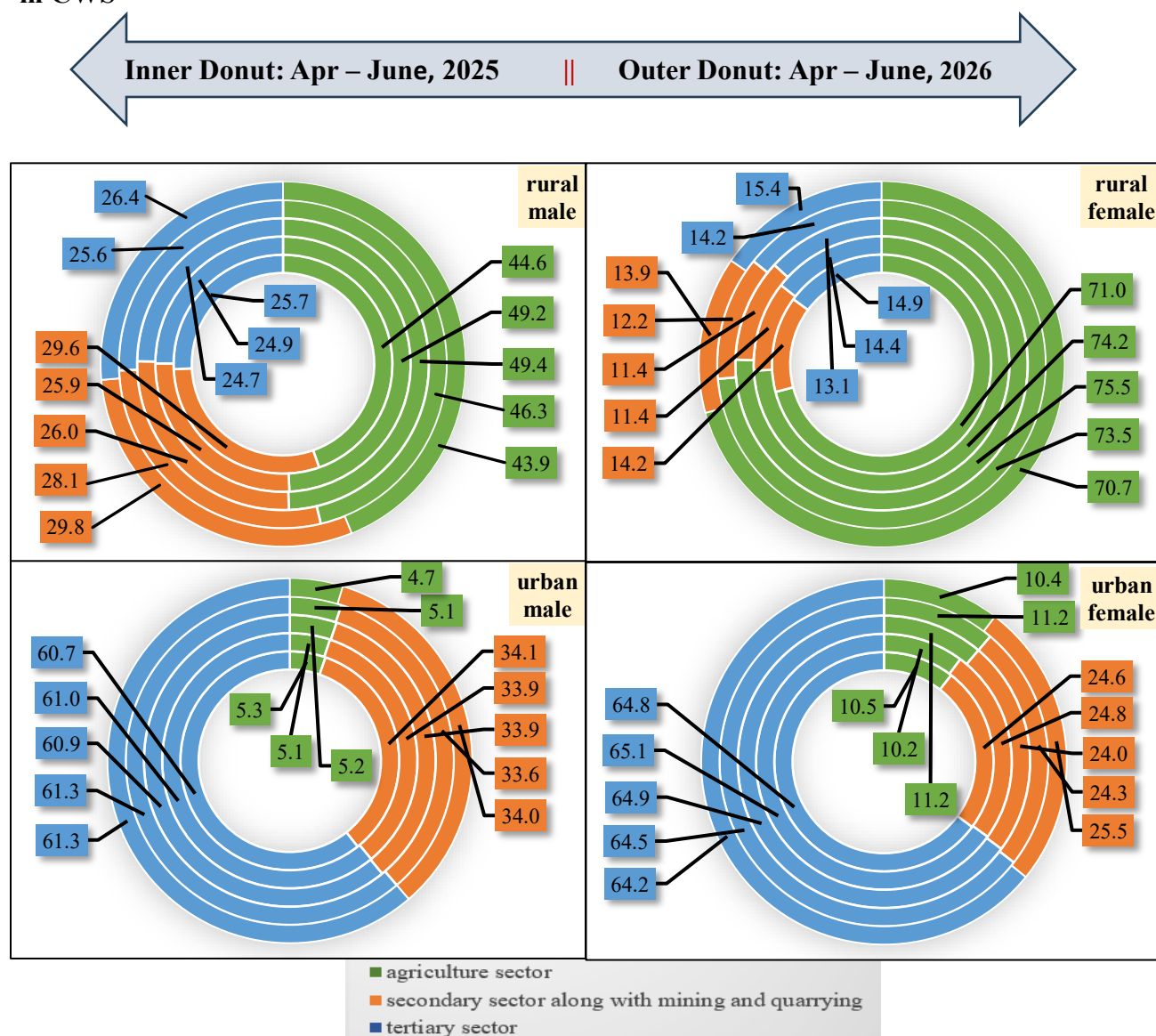
2.5.1 Three broad industries of work which have been considered here are agriculture sector (NIC-2025 Divisions 01 - 03), secondary sector along with mining and quarrying (NIC-2025 Divisions 05 - 43) and tertiary sector (NIC-2025 Divisions 45 - 99).

2.5.2 Distribution of workers of age 15 years and above in CWS, in these three broad industries of work, is given in Statement 4.

Figure 4: Percentage distribution of workers of age 15 years and above by industry of work in CWS



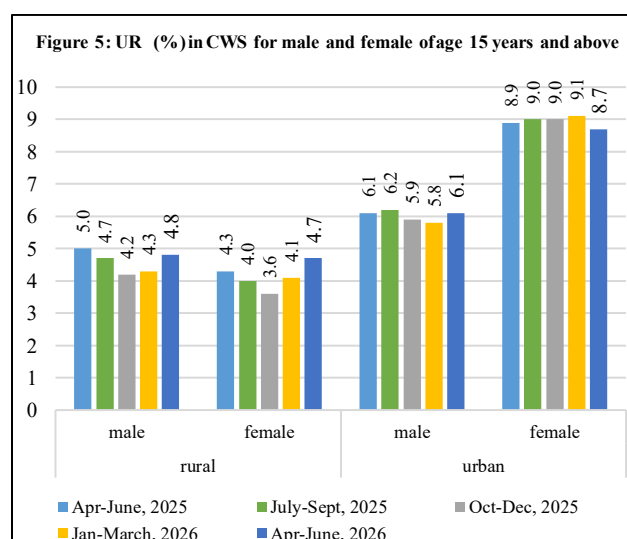
2.5.3 Percentage distribution of workers of age 15 years and above in CWS shows that in rural areas 43.9% of male workers and 70.7% of female workers were engaged in agriculture sector (NIC-2025 Divisions 01 - 03), while in urban areas, tertiary sector (NIC-2025 Divisions 45 - 99) was the industry of work reported for 61.3% of male workers and 64.2% of female workers of age 15 years and above during the quarter April - June, 2026.

2.5.4 **Detailed Table in Appendix A:** Percentage distribution of workers of age 15 years and above in CWS by broad industry of work for selected States is given in Table 4 of Appendix A.

2.6 Unemployment Rate (UR) in Current Weekly Status

2.6.1 Unemployment rate (UR) is defined as the percentage of unemployed persons in the labour force. The estimates of unemployed in CWS give an average picture of unemployment in a short period of 7 days during the survey period. According to the Current Weekly Status (CWS) approach, a person was considered as unemployed in a week if he/she did not work even for 1 hour on any day during the reference week but sought or was available for work at least for 1 hour on any day during the reference week.

2.6.2 UR (in percent) in Current Weekly Status for persons of age 15 years and above in the country during the quarter April - June, 2026 was 5.4 %. UR (%) in rural areas was 4.8% as compared to UR of 6.7% recorded in urban areas for persons of age 15 years and above during the quarter.



2.6.3 UR (%) among rural male of age 15 years and above was 4.8% during the quarter April - June, 2026. For rural female of the same age group UR (%) was found to be 4.7% during this quarter. In urban areas, UR (%) among female of age 15 years and above during quarter April - June, 2026 was 8.7% compared to 6.1% observed for male of the same age group.

2.6.4. UR (%) among persons of age 15-29 years was 15.9% during the quarter April - June, 2026.

2.6.5 In Statement 5, estimates of Unemployment Rate in CWS during the quarters April - June, 2025, July - September, 2025, October - December, 2025, January - March, 2026 and April - June, 2026 are presented for different age groups.

3. Sampling Design and Sample Size

3.1 Rotational panel components used for Quarterly estimates

3.1.1 In revamped PLFS design adopted from January 2025, a rotational panel sampling design is used for both rural and urban areas. In this rotational panel scheme, each selected household is visited four times in four consecutive months –in the beginning with first visit schedule in the first month and other three with the revisit schedule in the following three months. The rotational scheme will be of two years duration.

3.1.2 Using P_{11}^{FV} to denote sample units (First Stage Units in the multi stage design followed in PLFS) surveyed in the first month with the first visit schedule and P_{11}^{RV1} , P_{11}^{RV2} and P_{11}^{RV3} denote respectively the revisits conducted to the P_{11}^{FV} units using the revisit schedule, the rotational panel components used for generation of the quarterly estimates for the quarter April - June, 2026 is described in Figure 6.

3.1.3 The quarterly estimates for the quarter April - June, 2026 have been generated based on the information collected in

- third revisit in sample units P_{113} (i.e. P_{113}^{RV3}) and second revisit in sample units P_{114} (i.e. P_{114}^{RV2}) surveyed during April, 2026 and

- second revisit in sample units P_{115} (i.e. P_{115}^{RV2}) and first revisit in sample units P_{116} (i.e. P_{116}^{RV1}) surveyed during May, 2026 and
- first revisit in sample units P_{117} (i.e. P_{117}^{RV1}) and the first visit in sample units P_{118}^{FV} surveyed during June, 2026

This scheme of generation of quarterly estimates ensures a 50% matching of first-stage units (FSUs) between two consecutive quarters.

Appendix C

Mechanism adopted for generating worker estimates in absolute terms

The Worker Population Ratio (WPR) estimates in CWS obtained from PLFS has been applied on the projected population¹ made available by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) to generate the worker estimates in absolute terms.

For generation of the worker estimates the following calculation steps have been followed

- (i) The projected population figure for all age (0+) as on 1st July, 2026 from the MoHFW report gender-wise separately for urban areas and total (i.e. rural and urban areas combined) has been considered. The gender-wise population projections for all age (0+) for rural areas has been obtained by subtracting the urban figures from the total population projected.
- (ii) Using the sampling weights from PLFS the population proportion of male and female of age 15 years and above among the total population is worked out for rural and urban sectors.
- (iii) The proportion obtained from step (ii) is applied over the population projections disaggregated by gender and sector to arrive at respective population projections of age 15 years and above. The persons surveyed who have reported their gender as *transgender* has not been considered for the projection exercise as separate population projection for this gender category is not available in the MoHFW report.
- (iv) The Worker Population Ratio (WPR) in CWS for male and female of age 15 years and above is applied on the projected population of age 15 years and above [arrived following step (iii)] to generate estimates of the workers in absolute terms separately for gender and sector categories. These component-wise worker estimates are combined to arrive at the overall estimates.

The Table below describes how the steps mentioned above are applied for generating the worker estimates for the quarter April - June, 2026 in absolute terms. It may be noted that estimated totals may not match exactly due to rounding-off effects.

Note regarding estimation of number of workers

It may be noted that the accuracy of the worker estimates in absolute terms is dependent on the quality of the projected population figures. Regarding the projected population figures, it is to be noted that population projection is a scientific attempt to peep into the future population scenario, under certain assumptions by using available data at that point of time. The assumptions made with the probability of their coming out to be true form a critical input in this mathematical effort. Predicting the future course of human fertility and mortality is not an easy task, especially when looking ahead in time, is bound to be influenced by medical and health intervention strategies, food production and its equitable distribution, climatic conditions, socio-cultural setting, politico-economic conditions, and a host of other factors affecting the population dynamics. This makes it a really difficult exercise. Therefore, caution must be exercised while interpreting these worker estimates using the population projections in the context of various conditions imposed.
